Barrie Williams Obituary

It seems hard to believe that Club President, Barrie Williams has died. Barrie was the perennial youth, looked at least 20 years younger than his 79 years on this earth. Always cheerful, ready for a laugh and one of the most accomplished drivers of his generation.

Barrie started his career in rallying, in a Mini, that also served him in circuit racing, sprints and in any other motor sport event that took his eye.

In later years he became a stalwart of the Goodwood Revival meetings, sometimes driving/sharing six cars at one meeting. In between times, he raced in Formula 3, big saloons, little saloons and just about every classic car you can name in his exploits at Goodwood. Best remembered among the marshalling fraternity for his outrageous driving style in a Mazda RX3 – fully sideways and waving to the marshals.

Barrie always had time for the marshals and it was no surprise when he became the populous choice for Club President when Stuart Turner, then President, and Peter Roberts, Chairman, decided to stand down at the end of 2004. We had several suggestions for new President. Barrie won that ballot by a huge margin.



Barrie was pleased with his new appointment and, time permitting, he attended as many functions as he could and never missed an opportunity to display the Club badge. Soon after his appointment, he landed upside down in a gravel trap at Silverstone – calling immediately for special help, reminding his rescuers that he was the Marshals' Club President. Disappointment followed, when he found there was no lady marshal waiting to give him the kiss of life!!

He was elected a member of the British Racing Drivers' Club in 1971, served on the BRDC Board for fifteen years and remained a proud and prominent member of that Club until his sad demise.

Speaking privately to Barrie, one of his proudest achievements was his part in setting up the under-17 driving school at Silverstone, and the great number of youngsters he taught to drive and prepare for their driving tests. The course has progressed since the early days and it enables teenagers to get through their tests without too much difficulty.

RIP, Barrie; you will be fondly remembered by very many people and marshals will miss you as a very popular President.

The BMMC extends its deepest condolences to Barrie's partner Kathy and to his many friends throughout the motor sport world.

For the weekend I was in Fire one - something I haven't done for about 30 years.

I used to do it when it was the old Rover V8 and it used to sit at the new piece of track that is now pit side of Roberts. That was until an F3 hit it, then it was moved.

I was on there with Mark Hutton as Brian Bennett was not very well, hopefully he is on by now.

Now, being in the position on the GP pit entrance we had a slightly elevated position so the view although small was not unreasonable. On the newly revised MOT rear reversing lights must work, something this one hasn't done for 18 years.

Basically the wire had come off the reversing sensor as the tunnel gets all the buffeting from wind which had pulled the little button off the reverse gear sensor.

You must realise that you need to be a contortionist to work in the cockpit of a Caterham.

So out came the carpet the gear knob surround to reveal the inside of the tunnel.

On locating the wire I tried fixing it by holding the wire in position and pushing it on with a screwdriver.

To no avail.

An hour later I decided to unbolt the sensor, as I did I could see that the top of said sensor was getting closer to the offside of the tunnel. It was just pushing on the panel when it came unscrewed, lovely.

When out, I could see that the little fins that held the button in place were bent out and in a position that wouldn't hold a thing. So now armed with a pair of fine nosed pliers, they were all bent back into position.

Now button fitted and quite snugly fitting into it's place I endeavoured to reinstate it.

All was going well, when just as I was aliening the thread I dropped the sensor it into the tunnel. *+*^^!

The wire came off again and the sensor was under the drive shaft. So with a piece of rubber tube a litter pick up stick and a lot of swearing I got it back, eventually. I then cleaned it up and screwed it back in. Once again after a lot of cussing it was done about five hours later. It works! Test drive tomorrow...

Just goes to show if plan A doesn't work revert to plan B, then use plan C. Stay Safe
