NE Training Day Feedback

March 2019

In traditional style, the racing season started with Training Days taking place up and down the country, organised by different regions of the club, as well as other clubs too.

For the North East Region, we are proud to have our training day organised by the BMMC National Training Officer, Lynne Kendall—who is now working with Motorsport UK on a range of projects relating to training and is a member of the Training Working Group.

2019 so far has seen 48 marshals undertake training organised by the NE region, ranging from very experienced to absolute beginners who were waiting for their taster days! 85% of those attending were male, leaving the remaining 15% to represent women in motorsport.



We are pleased to continue our fantastic feedback completion rating of 100% - thanks to all attendees completing and handing in their evaluation forms.

Although the Spring training day did not include the practical carousel which includes fire fighting, 13 sessions were undertaken, meeting many of the Motorsport UK accredited modules required for marshal registrations and upgrades. Despite unfortunate illness striking, meaning that some trainers were unavailable at the last minute—the NE committee and regular trainers pulled together and worked hard to ensure everything still ran as planned.

On the whole the day was well received and positive feedback showed the day was rated good by 40% of attendees and Excellent by 54% of attendees (with the remaining 6% leaving the question blank).

All in all, attendees really valued the overall organisation of the day, the experience, enthusiasm and friendliness of the training team.

Other training events were held in the region at Croft and Harewood, ensuring that our region's marshals are all ready for the season ahead!




Grading Officers Roundup

With the season well underway, many of you will be collecting signatures for attendance and upgrade; here are a few reminders for what you need to do to ensure your upgrade goes smoothly:

- When collecting signatures, please do not utilise other pages meant for other grades—instead use a continuation sheet which is available from the MSA website or a PRC sized version can be obtained from the NE Grading Officer;
- If you cannot get an attendance signature from your post/sector chief, then go to race control and ask the Chief Marshal and/or Clerk of the course at the end of the day (or the post chief from an adjacent post if they have been able to observe you during the day);
- Encourage whoever is signing your card for the day to enter some comments—although it is accepted that there isn't much space, a comment to help you improve and develop will assist your marshalling journey, likewise, a positive comment of what you have done well will help you obtain your upgrade;
- When signing off an attendance signature for a colleague, ensure you write an appropriate comment on the PRC (good or developmental) to assist with future upgrading decision making;
- Ensure that you have all the correct attendance signatures and training day modules signed off before asking for an assessment to upgrade. Remember that you have to complete one duty per day and a signature is given for attendance/assessment if you have undertaken 6 hours or more of the same duty;
- If you require an upgrade assessment—let it be known to the Chief Marshal of the circuit or next event, so that they can try and accommodate your request within the post/duty allocations.
- Following successful assessment(s) Ensure that all signatures have been obtained correctly in the right order and that your training signatures are no more than 2 years old. Then send your paperwork (PRC, Motorsport UK registration form) off to the regional Grading Officer;

If you are having difficulties registering on the new BMMC database, then please read the following.

This registration is not just for the new Volunteering system but is the preferred method for updating your personal details held on the new Members database. We transferred the information from the old to the new database wholesale, so if there was any info out of date then it remains so until members register and update their profile. Contact us by email and quote your name and BMMC membership number and we will update your email address on the system allowing you to register. When you receive confirmation of your email update then please follow the registration instructions.

VOLUNTEERING

Competition Secretaries (Now known as Volunteering Co-ordinators) Their role in the system is to enter the event and add information as it becomes available. there are various fields and drop down lists for them to use to simplify the process, they should enter as much information as is available at the outset and add to it if more information becomes available.

There is the facility to add documents to the system for example sign on instructions, event timetables etc. As marshals volunteer the volunteers are collated and saved. If a marshal is unable to volunteer using the online system they can still contact their competition secretary or BMMC registered chief marshal and they are able to add the name to the list providing the marshal is a BMMC member. This removes the need for anyone to manually collate all of the BMMC volunteer
