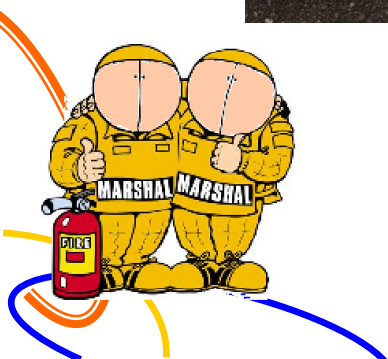

In this edition we bring you the usual updates and notifications of events.

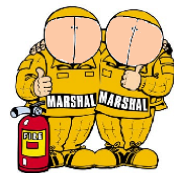
If there is anything you would like to be added to your newsletter please let me or one of your committee know. I am also after pictures from our circuits that I could use in future editions

The Chairman's Chat

My September chat starts with a reminder of what I stated at last year's National and Region AGM's that this will be my last year as your Regional Chairman and I will be standing down as Chairman at our 2019 Regional AGM, which also means that I will also be resigning as a Director of the BMMC. This has been a very hard decision for me to make, having been your Chairman for the last 8 years, but as one gets older there is always a greater risk of forgetting or getting something wrong. I don't want to put someone in the very difficult position of having to tell me it's time to quit. So I have made the very hard decision myself. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time representing you all on our National Council, made lots of friends and great acquaintances from all over the UK.



However, I am willing to remain as a member of the N.E Region committee, a position that I have held for over the last 30 years and feel I could manage another year or so with a lot less stress, work load, travelling around the Country, and keeping up with the changes in many different fields that's required in a Chair role.

Therefore as per Club rules and in the interest of democracy for our Regional Members, we will be following a nomination process for a

replacement Chairman. This process will involve formally notifying our members that I am standing down and asking them to nominate their preference of a replacement from the current Committee members. All nominations received will be collated and counted by our regional secretary, who will then contact those chosen to seek confirmation they are willing to accept/stand for the position. In the event of more than one committee member being nominated and accepting, then there will be a vote by all regional members to choose the successor. If only one committee member is nominated, then they will go forward for ratification at the regional AGM.

We have also been striving for a long time to get a more even representation of Members on the BMMC N.E. Region Committee for the whole of our Region. We are looking at increasing our Committee numbers, and nothing has changed, we are still looking. If you feel that you would like to help in the running of the BMMC N.E. Region or wish to find out more about the Committee please contact either me or any member of the Committee. If you are willing to join us, or at least give it a try, please get in touch with our Regional secretary as soon as possible.

Any new Committee Members coming on board will need to express an interest and be accepted by current committee by our October meeting, followed by ratification at the Regional AGM.

Soon you will also be receiving the formal notice of our forthcoming Region AGM. This is a time when election to the Committee etc takes place. Any current Committee Member, who has been in place for 3 years, will also need to be re-elected, which will be followed by ratification at the regional AGM; details of which will be on the formal AGM calling notice.

Enough of the legal matters affecting Committee members, let's move on to some of the outcomes and updates from the BMMC Council, who last met on Sunday 8th September.

Race against Dementia has now been adopted as the Club's designated Charity until the end of 2020.

The BMMC has adopted membership of the Employers Assistance Programme for all members. An Information sheet is included elsewhere in this newsletter.

The National Grading Officer, Steve Malec is standing down at the National AGM and will be replaced by Rob Mugurian of the North West Region.

Regalia is being updated with new lines coming, and I'm sure that our Region Regalia Officer will update you all when it becomes available. The region has received some new technology training equipment, which has been purchased with donations and bequeaths to the club.

Finally, it is that time of year when we look towards celebrating the commitment, conduct and attitude of our marshals – therefore, if you have worked with a NE regional member who has stood out from the crowd and goes above and beyond in their discipline – then why not nominate them for an award. Details of how to do so are elsewhere in this newsletter and will also be on our social media pages. To be able to meet the time factor for submitting nominations to the Motorsport UK awards as well, it was decided that the BMMC winners of 2018 will be put forward to Motorsport UK.

Grading Officers Roundup

Here are a few reminders for what you need to do to ensure your upgrade goes smoothly:

- * When collecting signatures, please do not utilise other pages meant for other grades—instead use a continuation sheet which is available from the Motorsport UK website or a PRC sized version can be obtained from the NE Grading Officer;
- * Ensure that you have all the correct signatures, assessments, training day modules, and paperwork (PRC, Motorsport UK Form) in place before sending off to the regional Grading Officer;
- * When collecting attendance signatures for upgrades, ensure that you only complete and have just one duty on the day recorded on your PRC, otherwise it cannot be counted for your upgrade.
- * When signing off an attendance signature for a colleague, ensure you write an appropriate comment on the PRC (good or developmental) to assist with future upgrading decision making;
- * If you require an upgrade assessment—let it be known to the Chief Marshal of the circuit or next event, so that they can try and accommodate your request within the post/duty allocations.

If you have any questions or require further advice - Please contact Lynne, our current NE Grading Officer.

MARSHALS REGISTRATION

If you are having difficulties registering on the new BMMC database, then please read the following.

This registration is not just for the new Volunteering system but is the preferred method for updating your personal details held on the new Members database. We transferred the information from the old to the new database wholesale, so if there was any info out of date then it remains so until members register and update their profile. Contact us by email and quote your name and BMMC membership number and we will update your email address on the system allowing you to register. When you receive confirmation of your email update then please follow the registration instructions.

Do it now.

VOLUNTEERING

Competition Secretaries (Now known as Volunteering Co-ordinators) Their role in the system is to enter the event and add information as it becomes available. there are various fields and drop down lists for them to use to simplify the process, they should enter as much information as is available at the outset and add to it if more information becomes available.

There is the facility to add documents to the system for example sign on instructions, event timetables etc. As marshals volunteer the volunteers are collated and saved. If a marshal is unable to volunteer using the online system they can still contact their competition secretary or BMMC registered chief marshal and they are able to add the name to the list providing the marshal is a BMMC member. This removes the need for anyone to manually collate all of the BMMC volunteer

We are at Pocono for the Indy race when it is the August meeting, but we will put the dates in our diaries for next year. It was a good day out, even though a bit further than before, from Wokingham.

Thanks to Steve and Julie and the rest of the team who keep this event going. It does the Club reputation a power of good and, with ex-Treasurer's hat on, makes a decent contribution each year to Club funds.

HSCC Meeting 18/19th May

Then, we arrived home to an invitation to the HSCC meeting at Silverstone the following weekend. This came from Jonny Westbrook, who initiated what is now known as the Dunlop Saloon Car Cup series and whom we have known since he was a very young man.

A quite different meeting from last, with some fancy machinery on display. Full grids for every race on Sunday (good to see) and some great racing. Circuit Standards

This was our first "proper" attendance at a UK race meeting since I retired in 2014. Even before then most of my Clerking activities, for ten years or more, had been out of the country. Good to be back – and visiting Silverstone, after ten years or more around foreign GP circuits, how in Heaven's name can Silverstone come in for so much criticism. Silverstone facilities, in my view, are as good as, or better than anywhere in Europe. OK, there are some circuits with plusher admin offices and "hostility" suites (the bits the "high ups" see) but overall "my local circuit" is well-maintained, with excellent safety features, and a great bunch of marshals.

Have a look behind the scenes at some areas at Spa; they look like derelict building sites. June has a great photo of the **single** toilet for the main grandstand at Hungaroring, with a high cistern and a string pull chain. First time I went to Monza with Radicals Euro Series, we were directed to the VIP car park – grass about a foot high! Later that weekend a low-slung sports car came in, a bit hot from the Autostrada perhaps, and promptly set the grass on fire. For anyone who has attended Sebring lately, where they still run major sports car meetings, that circuit is hardly luxurious, for officials, VIP's or spectators.
