Grading Officers Roundup

Here are a few reminders for what you need to do to ensure your upgrade goes smoothly:

- * When collecting signatures, please do not utilise other pages meant for other grades—instead use a continuation sheet which is available from the Motorsport UK website or a PRC sized version can be obtained from the NE Grading Officer;
- Ensure that you have all the correct signatures, assessments, training day modules, and paperwork (PRC, Motorsport UK Form) in place before sending off to the regional Grading Officer;
- When signing off an attendance signature for a colleague, ensure you write an appropriate comment on the PRC (good or developmental) to assist with future upgrading decision making;
- * If you require an upgrade assessment—let it be known to the Chief Marshal of the circuit or next event, so that they can try and accommodate your request within the post/duty allocations.

If you have any questions or require further advice - Please contact Lynne, our current NE Grading Officer (NB please note that a new Grading Officer will be appointed in January, due to Lynne taking up the Chair role).

speed & Hillclimb News

In 2019 some of the NE's membership have ventured to one or perhaps two of the region's speed venues during the 2019 season.

Harewood has been a regular feature on the calendar, with the Marshals Training, & Practice Days in March & the Spring National followed in April. The May event saw the British National championship contenders gather, whilst Vintage & Classic cars raced up the hill in June - Austin 7s, Rileys, Bentleys, Frazer Nashes & the like.

The next day's Harewood championship round - Fastest Time fell to Ben Tranter in an OMS/1 litre 'bike engined racing car which took 52.78 seconds - the youngest person to take an FTD at Harewood (to date !).

At July's British National round - a new outright hill record of 47.81 seconds, was set by Wallace Menzies in a Gould/3.3 litre Cosworth racing car & the old record was broken a further twice during the day. One of the early August meetings saw the Sunday abandoned after a car struck a building, leaving it unsafe & likely to fall on a vehicle. After repairs to the building, the late August meeting took place, with the Motorbikes returning, whilst the season drew to a close with the two championship contenders just a few points apart - Deryck Jones, Peugeot 205 GTi & Jonathan Mounsey, Mitsubishi Evo fighting for the title. Deryck Jones managed to retain his 2018 title.

NE marshals helped out at other sprint & hillclimb events: Blyton Park near Gainsborough, & Scammonden Dam, near Huddersfield - just under the M62. I ventured across to Barbon Manor in Cumbria for the British National round in July; & to Curborough in Staffordshire for the Vintage Speed Trials.

Thank You for marshalling at Cadwell Park in 2019

Dear Colleague,

Now that the season has closed on the car race events at Cadwell slightly later in the year than previously means it is time for me to write to thank you for your help and support as a marshal at Cadwell Park during 2019.

Once again this year we had a slightly more elongated season than last, picking up a few extra meetings, although it was a shame that some events advertised as two days were subsequently cut to just one. The meeting most people were apprehensive about was the 6hour EnduroKa event. This necessitated a significant change to the Assembly Area as it became the race pits and refuelling area for the day. The usual pit-lane being used only for the serving of penalties and there were plenty of those! The biggest handed out was a 10minute stop and go to one car. The race itself had to start under safety car as a car had to be recovered from the pit lane and after about 5 hours and 45 minutes of racing the safety car was called again to permit the recovery of a damaged vehicle resulting in a sprint finish. Those Marshals who were there generally gave it a thumbs up and rumour has it the event may well return in 2020. It demonstrated that Cadwell Park can be successfully used for such events.

This year we have been using the new Tower post at the Gooseneck intended to replace the previous posts 10 and 11. It remains a work in progress with a number of issues being identified during the year all of which have been passed on to the Circuit. I am advised though that the view is quite good! Post 3 has been relocated and again the issues raised as a result of this change have been passed on.

I should like to say well done everyone, you have again made me proud to be associated with you all, as always without your expertise and efficient team working and that of all marshals, race control, assembly, start-line and pit-lane, fire, rescue, recovery, safety car, medical, scrutineering, time-keeping and circuit crews working together the season would not have been the success that it was. Without the flexibility of all our volunteers, often working to duties you hadn't volunteered for we wouldn't have had the successful season we have had. Whether you were with us all season or just for one day, that help has been much appreciated and I hope we made that clear at each and every meeting. All clubs have asked at the end of every day that their thanks be extended to you all and I happily repeat their thanks once more here on their behalf.

The 2020 season will be with us sooner than we expect and who knows what events it may tantalise us with next year? Don't forget the MSA sanctioned Training Days in November and in the spring where all are welcome, details can be found on numerous internet websites. Once I know all next year's dates with reasonable certainty I shall be publishing them in the usual way and I hope that I can count on you marshalling with us again in 2020, and beyond.

In the meantime, thank you once again, a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to you and yours and I hope to see you at Cadwell Park again in 2020.

MARSHALS REGISTRATION

If you are having difficulties registering on the new BMMC database, then please read the following.

This registration is not just for the new Volunteering system but is the preferred method for updating your personal details held on the new Members database. We transferred the information from the old to the new database wholesale, so if there was any info out of date then it remains so until members register and update their profile. Contact us by email and quote your name and BMMC membership number and we will update your email address on the system allowing you to register. When you receive confirmation of your email update then please follow the registration instructions.

Do it now.

VOLUNTEERING

Competition Secretaries (Now known as Volunteering Co-ordinators) Their role in the system is to enter the event and add information as it becomes available. there are various fields and drop down lists for them to use to simplify the process, they should enter as much information as is available at the outset and add to it if more information becomes available.

There is the facility to add documents to the system for example sign on instructions, event timetables etc. As marshals volunteer the volunteers are collated and saved. If a marshal is unable to volunteer using the online system they can still contact their competition secretary or BMMC registered chief marshal and they are able to add the name to the list providing the marshal is a BMMC member. This removes the need for anyone to manually collate all of the BMMC volunteer
