Module	Synopsis	Ranking
<b>Basic Marshalling</b>	An introduction to Marshalling, covering the basic principles, requirements and expectations – ideal for cadets, tasters, all trainees, refreshers	
<b>Fire Theory</b>	Classroom based session on understanding motorsport fire risks, checking equipment and how to use it effectively, knowledge of fire prevention actions and procedures.	
<b>Fire Practical</b>	A Practical session incorporating checking and handling of equipment and extinguishing a car fire safely. (Sorry observation only for Under 18's)	
<b>FMOS Part 1 - Incident Handling</b>	A Theory session covering what to do in the event of an incident, handling drivers and vehicles for recovery, communicating with colleagues on post and track care.	
<b>Communication</b>	An interactive session covering communications with different personnel at a race event, and the different ways of communicating; as well as use of phones and radios.	
<b>Observation &amp; Report Writing</b>	Theory based session focusing on the skills required for good report writing and improving observations skills. Includes form filling and stewards experiences.	
<b>Flags</b>	This session covers the theory, actions and examples of good practice to conducting effective flagging when on post, and updates on procedures for Safety Car.	
<b>Incident Officer</b>	A session dedicated to the role of IOs which guides you through the skills and people management needed for coordinating team approaches to incident handling.	
<b>Mentoring</b>	A session focusing on the knowledge and skills needed to support, encourage, coach and mentor upcoming marshals – ideal for chiefs and examining grades.	
<b>Speed Intro</b>	An introductory session for Speed/Hillclimb Marshalling, covering the basic principles, requirements and expectations – ideal for cadets, tasters, all trainees, refreshers
