GRADING MATTERS

Due to the current unprecedented situation, a number of you may be concerned about being able to attend suitable training and/or sufficient events this year to maintain the Marshal grades you currently hold. Motorsport UK have stated that they "... would like to reassure the Marshal community that their current Marshal grades will not be affected, should they not be able to meet their grade maintenance requirements in 2020." There will be updates on the criteria for 2020 released, and as soon as this information is available it will be passed on.

Any grading applications should be sent electronically (scanned copies of PRC and Motorsport UK application forms) to your Regional grading Officer for processing until further notice. Please do not send items in the post at this time.

Fairly obviously, Motorsport UK are currently in the same situation as the rest of the country. As such, any upgrades or new members applications that have been sent to them recently will only be processed once things get back to normal and they return to Motorsport UK House. Please bear with them as they work through the backlog. All new members have been added to the BMMC database and should now have access to the volunteering system.

Speed & Hillclimb

An update from our regional rep, Tim:

I'm sure it's no different to any other form of motorsport, but It seems some clubs are unwilling to commit to any start-date just yet:. Many are reviewing the guidance provided by Motorsport UK and waiting for confirmation of any permits beginning to be issued, obviously once the Covid-19 lockdown has been lifted.

Already we have seen the cancellation of the following events with the Speed and Hillclimb discipline:

- Liverpool MC's Hillclimb at Barbon Manor on July 4th—cancelled
- BARC Yorkshire Centre's Hillclimbs at Harewood on 4th and 5th July—postponed
- Mid Cheshire MRC's Hillclimb at Scammonden Dam on 19th July—postponed (possibly to be run in September)
- Pendle DMC's Hillclimb at Scammonden Dam on August 15th—cancelled.

Other clubs appear to be aiming for a July start, with entries either being taken, perhaps without a fee from competitors at this stage; or holding them over - if submitted prior to the lockdown being imposed. Importantly - no-one at this stage, has said a definite 'yes' to an event actually going ahead ! - which is of course, what you would expect in these uncertain times !

If and when speed events do begin, we are hoping that something will take place at Harewood—hopefully as soon as August, but we await an update from the organisers later in the month.

The two events at Blyton Park - a Notts SCC spint on September 19th/20th, & a MiniCross Drivers Association rallycross, are now to be combined with a BTRDA round on October 4th.

In terms of future events, at the time of writing this article, it is hoped that the following events will be run, but keep an eye out on club websites and social media for any updates.

- Mid Cheshire MRC's Hillclimb at Scammonden Dam on 19th July
- Pendle MC / Huddersfield MC's at Scammonden Dam on 15th August







Speed and Hilldimb news continued...

Outside of our region, but other events you may wish to consider:

- Motorsport UK's Hillclimb at Barbon Manor on 4th July
- Longton DMC Sprint at Three Sisters on 26th July
- BMMC Sprint at Curborough on 29th August.
- Liverpool MC's Aintree Sprint at Barbon Manor on 5th September
- Longton DMC Sprint at Three Sisters on 6th September
- Longton DMC Sprint at Anglesey on 3rd/4th October

All the above dates are, of course, subject to the Covid-19 lockdown being lifted, and then Motorsport UK issuing permits for motorsport. Please keep an eye on all media avenues.

The Flag-bag in your Garden

Stuck at home during the lockdown? Missing your motorsport? Whether you have acres, a small garden, a balcony with pots or window boxes or just a sunny windowsill you can have fun with your flags and plants. Here's how...



Yellow is a really easy colour to grow. Sunflowers are the obvious choice if you have the space and if you have children the "who can grow the tallest" competition is a must. Other options include Cowslips for a wild garden feel or for a late summer early autumn colour why not try Chrysanthemum "Mermaid Yellow" (pictured).





Green is the easiest colour to find in the garden it is everywhere! But for something different why not try growing herbs? There are absolutely loads to choose from, but I recommend trying Rosemary, Sage, Parsley (pictured) and Thyme. Great for cooking and there is even a song in there somewhere!





Now I bet you think this one is going to be impossible? But it isn't! Two options are Linaria Flamenco or the Bo Jangle version of the French Marigold (pictured). Why not give both a try?





White has so many choices available. There are Roses such as White Cloud or Chrysanthemums again (lots to choose from) or for Spring flowering try Hyacinth White Pearl (pictured).



For Red my favourite is the Poppy (pictured) as it evokes thoughts of relatives who fought and died in world conflicts that we may live in peace. Other options include Tulips, Roses and many more. Of course with a greenhouse bright red tomatoes and red peppers (sweet or chilli) are great tasting options for the kitchen.



Blue can be grown if you are very lucky as the Blue Californian Poppy (I have not succeeded with that yet) or bluebells (make sure they are the English variety), Borage, a herb, or Cornflowers (pictured). The latter will take over the garden, the neighbours' gardens and perhaps even the world if you let it.



The Black and Orange (or Meatball) flag can be best represented by either Orange Sunflowers or the orange variety of Black-Eyed Susan, a climbing plant (pictured).





The Black and White (or naughty driver) flag can be grown as a white variety of the sunflower (pictured) or a black and white variety of anemone.





It is hard to find pure black in nature (take a close look at a black cat and you will find it's fur is actually a very dark brown) but examples that get very close are those such as Queen of the Night Tulips, or the black variety of the canna lily (pictured).





For this one we need to cheat a little and use a mixed variety of Salvias to achieve the required colours all from one type of plant. Now if you are very clever you could sow the seeds in such a way as to replicate the flag itself!



For the Chequered flag the same options exist as for the Black and White above. In this case here is an image of a black and white anemone.





Purple (or probably more accurately Lilac) and white can often be found together in nature. Examples such as a purple and white variety of Fuchsia (pictured) are easily grown.



And there you have it, a complete flag-bag in the garden.

Now, how many of you recognise the order of the flags above? Did you pay attention at the last Flag Training session you attended? Yes, that's right, they are in the same order as presented in that session!

Ever wondered what goes on, behind the scenes and away from racing?...

Whichever club you've marshalled for - whether it be race, rally, sprint/Hillclimb or any other motorsport discipline; that club will be affiliated to Motorsport UK (the nation's sporting governing body) and will be a member of a Regional Association within Britain.

You may not be aware of Regional Associations, but they started way back in 1947; with the gathering of a number of Northern Hillclimb organisers at a hotel in Huddersfield to try to sort out the clashes of Hillclimb dates in the north - that resulted in the formation of the Association of Northern Car Clubs, which celebrated it's 70th anniversary in 2017. The BMIMC North East Region is still a member of this association today! After much opposition & distrust by the Royal Automobile Club, they relented - realising the benefit of having representatives of each club in a regional group; rather than having to deal with each car club individually ...and the rest, as they say is history. There are now 270 car clubs within the Motorsport UK network.

Today there are thirteen associations covering the whole of the UK from Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland & England. The Republic of Ireland has it's own set-up within Motorsport Ireland.



The BMIMC is also a UK wide club and is split into regions, all of which are members to their local regional associations, to ensure that marshals have a voice and avenue for information across all areas of motorsport.

BMMC's representation at Motorsport UK...

BMIMC is also fairly well-represented at Motorsport UK within the various specialist committees that provide advice and expert knowledge to motorsports UK governing body, as set out below:

- Our National Chairperson Nadine Lewis (North West region) of the sits on the Race committee, the Volunteer Officials committee and is Chair of the Marshals Advisory Group.
- Peter Lawton (NE region) sits on the Sprint & Hillclimb sub-committee as well as the Clerk's & Steward's Advisory Group.
- John Jones (NW region) BRMC's Chairman also sits on the Marshals Advisory Group.
- Most pleasing to our region, our own regional Chairperson Lynne Kendall sits on the Training Advisory Group, which supports her other role as the BMMC National Training Officer.

All of this representation is done on a voluntary basis, in the same way as our marshalling hobby is undertaken, often being juggled with busy work and family life too—so please support our representatives and committees—and remember to thank them too sometimes, instead of just giving a list of issues or other jobs to do.

MARSHALS REGISTRATION

If you are having difficulties registering on the new BMMC database, then please read the following.

This registration is not just for the new Volunteering system but is the preferred method for updating your personal details held on the new Members database. We transferred the information from the old to the new database wholesale, so if there was any info out of date then it remains so until members register and update their profile. Contact us by email and quote your name and BMMC membership number and we will update your email address on the system allowing you to register. When you receive confirmation of your email update then please follow the registration instructions.

VOLUNTEERING

Competition Secretaries (Now known as Volunteering Co-ordinators) Their role in the system is to enter the event and add information as it becomes available. there are various fields and drop down lists for them to use to simplify the process, they should enter as much information as is available at the outset and add to it if more information becomes available.

There is the facility to add documents to the system for example sign on instructions, event timetables etc. As marshals volunteer the volunteers are collated and saved. If a marshal is unable to volunteer using the online system they can still contact their competition secretary or BMMC registered chief marshal and they are able to add the name to the list providing the marshal is a BMMC member. This removes the need for anyone to manually collate all of the BMMC volunteer
