
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## **Cover Story.**



July 2001 holds a special place in the history of motoring. It was the first time that Daimler Benz produced a Mercedes car, the first time from the recession of the early 1990's that the classic car market started to recover and for the first time in many years people started to appreciate that cars, like art and precious metals, could be a safe investment.

In July 2001 I just happened to be in Hornchurch Essex visiting family friends. In central London was a display of 100 years of the Mercedes Benz including a small number of race cars from the Mercedes museum covering the years 1930 to 1990. Along with the cars was a large display of photographs of famous owners. Al Jolson owned a 1930's SSK, works driver Carraciolla had a supercharged 370 convertible Frank Sinatra and Grace Kelly had new 190SL cars, Sophia Loren and Doris Day had 300 SI Gullwing cars as did Picasso ( the family still owned the car in 2001) Peter Sellers and George Best both owned Mercedes 350 SEL convertables and Eric Clapton, Peter Sellers and Ralph Loren all ran 500 SL cars. Their most famous customer was Aryton Senna who owned several 500 and 560 SEC saloons all upgraded to his personal spec.

Also on show in London was products from the new Eagle Car Company selling 'what were effectually new E Type Jaguars. They had customers in Saudia, USA, Argentina, Malaysia, Hong Kong and Switzerland and had already sold their first SuperSport model, the most powerful road legal E Type ever with a top speed of over 180 MPH.

While in London I discovered that the whole Classic Car market which had suffered a slump in the early 1990's was at last showing signs of recovery. It started with Elton John who had some financial difficulties and sold off several of his cars. All of his cars sold by Christies went for way above their estimate. His 1973 Rolls Royce Phantom sold for £223,000, the 1956 Bentley S1 Fastback sold for £196,000 (estimated at £70,000) Aston Martin V8 £102,000 (double the top estimate) and the 1965 E Type £80,000 at a time when you could buy a nice E Type for £20,000. His well used 1962 RR Silver Cloud had a reserve of £30 grand but sold for £86,000. It was said at the time that the starry eyed new owners, should they wish to sell faced a massive loss.

However it was this sale that started a steep upward climb in the market that lasted for many years.

Had I known, or if I had had the money, July and August 2001 was the ideal time to invest. It was the last time you could buy a decent E Type for £20 grand, an Austin Healey 3000 for £14,000 or a nice 1940/1950's MG TC TD or TF for £`12 grand. By 2005 E Types were selling for £40 grand and by 2015 £90 grand.

#### More Classic Car News

The market continues to thrive in spite of covid. May and June sales went better than expected with Historic's selling a nice Triumph Stag well above estimate at

£27,160 (a record?). They also got top money for a restored 1973 BMW 3.0 CSI selling for £52,680. As expected the ex Pat Moss Austin A40 Farina Rally car sold well fetching £45,000 in spite of needing some detailing work.



# Robert's RallyBuzz

## Great Start to NI Championship

Jonny Greer and Kirsty Riddick in their first outing in a Citroen C3 R5 won the first stage rally to be held in NI since lockdown restrictions were eased. The McGrady Insurance Bishopscourt Stages took place minus spectators last month. Round one of the 2021 Motorsport UK Northern Ireland Rally Championship had attracted a maximum entry of 100 cars to the Co.Down race circuit. Ballynahinch and District MC were the organisers and they put on a very successful return to rallying. The event ran without a hitch.

There were six sealed surface stages all within the confines of the track and its link roads. Marshals from our club were present to assist with timing and other duties. A total of 500 competitors, service crew and officials were allowed to attend.

Eight times NI Rally Champion Derek McGarrity was the pre event favourite. He last won the title in 2018, but has been victorious at this particular venue an incredible 13 times. In fact the Glengormley man remained unbeaten over the Bishopscourt stages for the past nine years. This year would be different!

Driving an ex-Marcus Gronholm 2007 Ford Focus WRC McGarrity won stage one by eight-tenths of a second from Greer but ultimately lost out to the more nimble newer C3 of the 2017 Champion over the course of the event. In fact Jonny Greer was fastest on all the remaining five stages to dominate the rally, winning by 33.3 seconds.

Third place went to the Fiesta R5 of 2019 Champion Stephen Wright while Phillip Allen was fourth in his Hyundai i20 R5. Top 2-wheel-drive finisher was Barry Morris in a Darrian T90. A total of 99 cars actually started stage one and 70 of them finished the rally.

Competitors can now look forward to round two of the NI Championship next month at Ballykelly. Three more rounds are then scheduled to follow the Dogleap in this 100% tarmac series between August and November. Let's just hope they will all be as successful as Bishopscourt.


#### From the Archives.
