BILL GRAY: MARSHAL OF THE YEAR 2018 BELLINI & BARRIE WILLIAMS TROPHIES

Bill has enhanced our training with his quietly efficient way of working, and his proven organisational skills. A much-respected Post Chief and an Examining Speed Marshal. Bill has been Chief Marshal for Liverpool Motor Club for many years.

Bill also received the inaugural Barrie "Whizzo" Williams BMMC Racing Marshal of the Year Trophy which was sponsored by Cataclean who provided a number of gifts – an exclusive British Motorsports Marshals Club (BMMC) Teamwear jacket recognising Bill's achievements, a British Touring Car Championship official merchandise kit as worn by the Rowbottom team and a free set of BMMC overalls.

WALTER HOLME Jnr - FLAG MARSHAL OF THE YEAR 2018
THE DON HALL TROPHY

Our brand new award is launched in remembrance of dear old Don Hall. The award is funded from the legacy bequeathed to North West Region by another stalwart, Cliff Hammond. Walter (Wally) Holme is the very worthy inaugural winner given his dedication to the art of Flaq Marshalling as demonstrated over so many years.

A long-standing practitioner in the role of Chief Flag Marshal, particularly at Anglesey Circuit, which he has made his own for some 20-odd years. Wally is the "go to" person when support is required - particularly on the Isle of Mon where he advises on the art of holding on to flags and Safety Car boards without being blown away by a Force 10 gale!

In addition, Wally turns his hand to on-the-bank flagging whenever called-upon, deploying the skills acquired over so many years.

Those many years now total 38 - he started young and stuck at it! It all began with a trip to Liverpool with a couple of family members to spectate at Aintree Circuit before he took up marshalling the following season when he also began to attend Oulton Park. In essence, Wally is the Role Model for all aspiring Flag Marshals.

The recipient was "humbled" to win the accolade especially as it was named after Don Hall who was so well-known in the North West Region "for his knowledge and story-telling..." according to Wally.

In the early days of his life in orange, the idea that Wally was eventually going to flag never crossed his mind (pun intended!). At that time, he was leaping off the bank to deal with incidents and then later became a fire marshal. (Continued......)

Wally says, "It was something of a steep learning curve when flagging first came into my marshalling career. One 750 MC meeting they were short of flag marshals so I volunteered telling them I knew what the flags meant! I was duly dispatched to the "easy" flag post at Lodge In. It was a baptism of fire to say the least! But it did not scare me off... I duly started to volunteer more for flag duties before eventually qualifying as a Flag Marshal."

The experience of flagging from Wally's position on the start/finish straight at Anglesey changed when the circuit was reconfigured as the prevailing wind now blows straight into his face instead of being to his side with the previous orientation of the pit-lane.

At least the allocation of marshals to their flag posts is handled by the Chief Marshal at Anglesey rather than Wally himself as, unlike Oulton Park, the lower numbers mean all roles can be handed out by one person. Nonetheless the Chief Flag Marshal is always there to provide advice from his many years of hands on experience.





HARRY MITCHELL - CADET MARSHAL OF THE YEAR 2018 STUART ASHFORD & DAVID LESLIE TROPHIES

Harry was a quiet lad during his first season but his true personality emerged in 2018 when he was "ever ready" to do any and all of the tasks asked of him. His mum, Diane told us that he has come a long way in the last few years both at the circuit and at home.

He sends the cars out of the Assembly Area through the pit-lane where his father, Mark Pickard, is also a marshal.

Harry is really into his cars and loves Formula 1, the British Touring Car Championship, British GTs and Rallying.

The BMMC's North West Committee report that Harry is willing and enthusiastic making him a worthy winner of this award.



DENNIS BRYAN (OUTSTANDING SERVICE)
THE STAN FOULDS TROPHY - 2018

Dennis was very surprised to win our Outstanding Service Award. He has been marshalling for around 20 years and really enjoys his hobby not least because it brings him into contact with like-minded people – he has made many great friends within the orange community over the years. These relationships are key when incidents occur as trust in other people is vital in delivering the best outcome for those involved.

Bryan, who has always been interested in cars and is a mechanic by trade, was a rally marshal during the 1980s - he even took part in some events. He first provided safety cover at a race meeting in 1999, focussing mostly on Donington Park before switching to Oulton. He still tries to get to the Derbyshire circuit when he can.

Having claimed his red badge and gained experience out on the bank, Dennis was invited to join the Fire Truck by Glyn Williams and Ian Clare in 2007. It was something he readily accepted as the role appealed to him.

The biggest fires he has attended both involved Ginettas - Hunter Abbott and Colin White were the drivers. In each case, both fire trucks were scrambled and it took the large powder units on the units plus about 20 extinguisher bottles to get each fire under control with additional help from the marshals on post

His day usually begins before any competition vehicles has had the chance to combust as he takes extinguishers, Safety Car boards and flags to all the marshals' posts.

Dennis is an assistant co-ordinator of the North West Region's 15 strong Fire Truck team who undertake advance fire training at each training day so that they are always ready when a driver needs their skills.



RICHARD McNEIL (EXTRAORDINARY ACTION) THE FRED BYATT TROPHY - 2018

Our occasional award for noteworthy contribution to marshalling.

There are many marshals who only have to think of themselves, ie "What do I fancy doing this weekend? Should I try this or that circuit?" Richard, together with pursuing his own ambitions in Orange, has introduced, supported - and transported - family members to several circuits as they gained experience in their favourite hobby.

Wife, Jilly, and children, Suzie, James and Christina have all experienced different roles at a number of circuits. Indeed, daughter Suzie won Cadet of the Year for 2014 and son James was Newcomer of the Year for 2017.

And yet Richard finds time for himself; going for IO, Rescue Unit duty, driving the fire truck. You name it, Richard has done it! Even rallies in the shape of the North West Stages and WRC!

Logistically all this has recently become a little more complicated because Suzie and James are now at University (Lincoln and Preston) but the family still needs to ensure someone is available to sign-on youngest child Christina.

As is often the case, Richard was "shocked" to win the award but at least it put to bed a long-standing joke amongst his family as he was the only one of them not to have taken an accolade even though marshalling was originally his hobby rather than theirs.

During the course of the season, the McNeil family are at a motorsporting event almost every weekend. Two-day BMMC training programmes can be quite intensive as Richard, his wife and the kids cover a lot of disciplines.

McNeil has travelled far beyond the shores of the UK to get his racing fix, the furthest he has ventured is to Baku for the Azerbaijan Grand Prix in 2017. He has also spectated at the Belgian GP with his son and the duo will soon return to marshal at the event with Jilly.

When marshalling locally, the family tend to travel together although they split up to undertake their different duties on arrival. In the past, not all the family have made the trip to circuits that are further afield but that may change when Richard's children finish at University as the family intend to marshal in Canada/America.

What started out as a hobby for Richard which saw him have some amazing weekends with his friends developed into family weekends at Anglesey where Jilly took their young children to the beach and local attractions while he enjoyed his motorsport at Trac Mon.

That all changed when Suzie was persuaded to try her hand as a cadet marshal in the wind-swept Assembly Area. She enjoyed it far more than she expected since when the McNeils have become a family in orange.

Richard says, "The opportunities marshalling has given us as parents is amazing. How many dads can say they went on a 'lads' trip to the Formula E with ten blokes and the 18 year old daughter - camping!!! Or sleeping in the back of a car when taking with my son to rallies in the welsh forests!"

The McNeils thoroughly enjoy being a marshalling family especially as it has brought them into a wider circle of wonderful friends in orange. The shared love of motor sport is a focal point for conversations and allows mum and dad to connect with their children. Richard reflects, "Despite the logistical issues, the long days, the task of keeping track of volunteering, washing four marshalling kits and the many varied locations, I can safely say it's all worthwhile because the hobby has brought us together as a family!"
