Tom Wilson 1951 - 2019

Tom Wilson was a valued, respected and loved member of the Scottish Motorsport Marshals Club.

For over 40 years, Tom's main pastime was motor sport, and his motor sport and rescue career was extensive. As well as marshalling at the monthly motor racing meetings at Ingliston in the late 1970s, he would regularly travel down south to Donington Park or Silverstone to marshal at big events.

After moving to London for work, he was in his element working all week and marshalling at Silverstone, Donington Park and Rockingham most weekends, with a yearly excursion to Le Mans.

When he returned to Dundee, he decided to slim down his long-distance motor racing activity and do more with the Scottish Motorsport Marshals Club and he joined the Motor Sport Rescue team. He even started going to spectate at things like the <u>Goodwood Revival</u>, where, as you would expect, he got right into the swing of dressing in period clothing.

Tom was a highly experienced marshal and Rescue Team member who volunteered at many events - from local club stage rallies to international Grand Prix races - from Brands Hatch to Croft to Knockhill, from the Isle of Mull to Abu Dhabi... and many, many more. As we say in Scotland, Tom was a well-kent face, and tributes from across the globe flooded in on social media over the last couple of weeks.

In 2018, Tom was the very worthy recipient of the <u>Jim Clark Marshalling Award</u>. The Award is made to such member of the Scottish Motorsport Marshals Club who, in the sole opinion of the Committee, has made a significant or meritorious contribution to motor sport marshalling in Scotland.

Club Secretary Rod Howat, who with others in the team worked with Tom on the Rescue Units, said, "Tom was one of the most generous people I have ever known in every respect."

Long-standing friend Paul Moscrop recalls how he and Tom had been best mates for well over 30 years. They met at Silverstone and both went on to do rescue together. Paul says, "Tom was such a big-hearted man. He loved to be around people always having a laugh. I will miss him so much and so will so many others."

Wherever Tom went he made friends and made people laugh, such was his infectious nature – at work and with the various social events and marshalling with all the different clubs.

One of his oldest friends, Alan Martin, said "I know I will miss him terribly. Tom was one in a million, a great and loyal friend, the life and soul of every party, and one of life's real treasures. Gone but never to be forgotten."

Alan recalls one of the last conversations he had with Tom. They were talking about the arrangements for the funeral – a slightly morbid and difficult subject – but as always, Tom introduced some levity to the discussion. Talking about his clothes for the day – Alan mentioned that a nice suit might be appropriate, or perhaps one of Tom's amazing Goodwood outfits. "Na..." said Tom, and with a wry smile on his face he added, "I've decided on my Nomex fireproof rescue overalls. I hope they got extra gas in and can turn up the heat – they'll need to!"

At Tom's funeral, *Remember Me*, a poem by painter and poet David Harkins, was read out:

You can shed tears that he is gone
Or you can smile because he has lived.
You can close your eyes and pray that he will come back
Or you can open your eyes and see all that he has left.
Your heart can be empty because you can't see him
Or you can be full of the love that you shared.
You can turn your back on tomorrow and live yesterday
Or you can be happy for tomorrow because of yesterday.
You can remember him and only that he is gone
Or you can cherish his memory and let it live on.
You can cry and close your mind, be empty and turn your back
Or you can do what he would want: smile, open your eyes, love and go on.

We have said goodbye to a true gent, a motorsport legend and an all-round good egg! He will leave a huge void in the lives of those who knew him. Time will ease that, but we will miss him terribly. His dedication, enthusiasm, intelligence and sense of humour will be remembered.

Rest in peace, dear friend.

Grading Gripes

Collecting Signatures

With the 2019 season now well underway; many of you will be collecting signatures for attendance and upgrade. Here are a few reminders for what you need to do to ensure your upgrade goes smoothly:

- When collecting signatures, please do not utilise other pages meant for other grades. In stead use a continuation sheet which is available from the BMMC website "Need To Know" dropdown. Remember to ensure your name and registration number is recorded on the sheet and is securely attached to the PRC.
- Ensure that you have the correct signatures, assessments, training day modules, and paperwork PRC and Motorsport UK Form (MRF) in place, before sending off to the regional Grading Officer.
- When signing off an attendance signature for a colleague, ensure you write an appropriate comment on the PRC (good or developmental) to assist with future upgrading decision making.
- If you require an upgrade assessment; in advance, let it be known to the Chief Marshal of the circuit or next event, so that they can try and accommodate your request within the post or duty allocations.

Newly Registered Marshals

Your first step on the grading ladder will be to Marshal level. You need to complete the attendance and training requirements, and the Upgrade Assessment(s), but there is no minimum or maximum time limit in which you can upgrade. For further information, go to the BMMC website www.marshals.co.uk, click on the "Need To Know" dropdown where you will find grading scheme guidance notes; flow-charts; training and assessment requirements.

101 year old Witness in Murder Trial

Mike Abbott sent me an extract from the Daily Telegraph (23rd May) regarding a 101-year old lady witness in a murder trial. The lady in question was Liz Zettl, who many of the "more senior" members of South Mids and surrounding regions may remember from BRDC and other major events at Silverstone.

Liz was and is a true lady. She and Anne Pullen combined on race telephones at Silverstone for many years. Popular with everyone and widely known as "the ladies" who manned race phones at Silverstone. I am not sure exactly when Liz retired but I believe she was into her eighties before she did.

Three or four years ago I had the great pleasure to be sat next to Liz at a Doghouse charity dinner in the BRDC suite. Observing the adage, "One does not ask a lady's age", I did not enquire but was reliably informed Liz was in her late nineties.

Well, you would never have guessed that! Once she placed who I was ("Weren't you the Marshals' Club Treasurer for a while?") we did not have much to say to others around us. Dredging up all the names of times passed - Jimmy Brown (loyal friend of BMRMC), Tony Salmon, Pierre Aumonier and a load of other names I cannot now remember, but I bet Liz would!! I can see why the Judge made the remarks he did in the recent trial.

Guest Speaker at the Doghouse event was John Bercow, Speaker of the House of Commons. Despite the criticism we read of his alleged antics in the House, he gave a varied, interesting and very humorous talk that evening. He and Liz are near neighbours and he made many kind references to her in his speech.

Liz is believed to be the oldest witness ever to give evidence in a murder trial. The trial at which she was giving evidence concerned a nasty plot to kill and rob elderly people of their last few bob. We must be eternally grateful that they did not get to Liz. (DT article attached)

101-year-old witness in murder trial 'may have been next target'

BRITAIN'S oldest court witness yesterday gave evidence at a murder trial that heard she may have been the next victim.

Elizabeth "Liz" Zettl, 101, relived the moment she was told by police how two men on trial for killing a pensioner had a copy of her will.

The court was shown evidence that the defendants, Martyn Smith, her lodger, and his friend Benjamin Field,

had an emailed copy of the will.

Mr Field, 28, a church warden, and
Mr Smith, 32, a magician, are accused
of conspiring to murder retired
lecturer Peter Farquhar, 69, in Maids
Moreton, Bucks. Mr Field is accused of attempting to murder retired teacher Ann Moore-Martin, 83. Both were allegedly targeted in a "gaslighting" plot.

Ms Zettl appeared in court as a video was shown of her police interview when she was told that Mr Field and Mr Smith had a copy of her will. She sug-

gested the only reason why Mr Smith may have a copy was because he had "scrawled" a telephone number on the

scrawled a telephone number on the back and needed the piece of paper. It is understood she is the oldest person to ever give evidence in a criminal court. She told police her lodger was "absolutely no trouble".

The court heard police discovered

the will on Mr Field's university server as an email attachment which Mr Smith sent himself from her email address.

The prosecution say this was so they could "see what she was worth".

After her evidence, Ms Zettl told Mr

Justice Sweeney: "Sorry it wasn't very helpful but my memory's not as good as it was." The judge replied: "If we're all as bright as you are at your age, we will have great cause to be grateful." Mr Smith, of Penhalvean, Cornwall,

also denies three counts of fraud, one asso demes three counts of traud, one of burglary and one of possession of an article for use in fraud, namely Liz Zettl's will. Mr Field, of Olney, is additionally charged with one count of burglary, three of fraud and one of possession of an article for use in fraud – also in relation to Ms Zettl's will.

He admitted the three fraud counts and the burglary. Also in the dock was Mr Field's brother Tom Field, 23, of Olney, Bucks, who is charged with fraud by false representation.

The trial continues.
