## Welcome to the Newsletter for

## the South Midlands Region

As predicted in the last Newsletter there is light at the end of the tunnel. Vaccinations are being carried out across the country and the virus is in retreat, but we still have a way to go so PLEASE continue to observe the Covid regulations and we will get through this. See the latest guidance at: <u>https://www.motorsportuk.org/covid-19/</u>.

Motor racing returns to Silverstone on 17<sup>th</sup> April with VSCC on the National Circuit followed shortly after with a double header on 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> April on both the National Circuit for 750MC and International Circuit for BARC. With two circuits in use on both days volunteers should be welcomed. However, because of social distancing requirements I anticipate that numbers on post will be limited as they were at the end of 2020. So, if you are ready to get marshalling volunteer early. Unfortunately, this probably means trainees will have to wait a bit longer before they can get started. If you are still graded as a trainee but have a few meetings under your belt you might be lucky to get invited if you include with your application your marshalling history especially at weekends when both circuits at Silverstone are in use.

Organising clubs are looking to continue the use of virtual signing on so all marshals that are accepted for a meeting should receive passes and joining instructions beforehand. If you don't get invited to a meeting you volunteered for check with the organising club, but don't turn up at the gate without the relevant paperwork, it will be a wasted journey.

Matt our regional Training Officer has been running some virtual training sessions on Zoom, I hope those of you that attended have enjoyed them and learnt something new. I delivered a couple of Flag training presentations using a Q&A process which seems to have been well received. If you want to refresh your skills you can still access training sessions via the Motorsport UK Training hub: <u>https://www.motorsportuk.org/introducing-the-motorsport-uk-learning-hub/</u>. To access training material all you have to do is register as a member of Motorsport UK. The training material exists to refresh skills and does not qualify as a signature on your PRC.

There are some big changes coming with the introduction of a revised marshals grading scheme in September. A national consultation regarding the proposed changes will commence soon starting with organising clubs and cascading down through senior official and all registered marshals. Keep your eyes open and feel free to comment on the proposals. Chief changes are recognising all Trainees as being such across all disciplines so that they can chose which discipline they are most suited to, and changing the status of Examining Grades to Assessor and removing it from the grading ladder. Assessors will need experience in the discipline they are assessing and will be required to undertake training on a regular basis.

On 30<sup>th</sup> March we are having another virtual Noggin & Natter. The guest (victim?) this time is Ben Edwards our President, see notice elsewhere in this Newsletter for details of how to get invited.

#### The Late and Great Murray Walker OBE

How very sad that the late and great Murray Walker OBE has finally slipped away, at the ripe old age of 97. Many of us, I am sure, felt Murray would go on forever, but this was not to be.

My memories of the great man began when he became President of the Marshals' Club. I cannot remember exactly who proposed him, but it met with instant and unanimous approval at Council. The only hesitancy was that Murray insisted he would accept the position only if he could offer genuine help. June and I, by chance, had a long discussion with Murray before his first formal appearance, at a South Mids Club Night, one of the many occasions when he made big inroads to a very busy lifestyle to accommodate the marshals. I consider that we, and others who joined in on that discussion (Bob Sketchley for instance), made a decent job of persuading Murray he had an awful lot to offer our Club.

Sure enough, he did. From then on, he made a point of praising all marshals, not just BMRMC members, reserving praise for the British marshals, "arguably the best in the World" at that time. We heard his commentary in a couple of different countries around the World, and he never failed to give mention to the vital part marshals played in motorsport, at all levels. A habit, I am pleased to say, that has continued right through to the present Sky F1 team who regularly praise volunteer marshals at appropriate times – no more so than in the amazing escape of Romain Grosjean from that fiery interlude at the end of last season. On an international basis, though, the practice began with Murray.

As an aside, we enjoy the same level of attention from the Family Douglas – father, Keith (sadly deceased), founder member of the Marshals' Club, two sons, Russell and Alistair, and even a grandson now joined that team!

Back to Murray, though. Murray had a frenetic lifestyle, yet he always found time for Marshals' Club training days, etc. One especially he describes in "50 Years of Motorsport Marshalling" where he almost passed out at the re-telling of some injuries sustained in the sport at one of our medical forums! Chris Hobson, organiser of the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dinner, managed to secure the services of Murray <u>and</u> Stuart Turner (motorsport's answer to Peter Ustinov) as entertaining speakers at that event.

For our own part, June and I met up with Murray at a whole host of other events over the years. We were hugely flattered that he always remembered who we were and, if I were on my own, he asked after June – or vice versa if June met up with him at a Doghouse Ladies event. Murray had an amazing memory for names and faces.

I was elected President of the British Plastics Federation in 1994/5. The BPF was then one of the largest trade organisations in the UK and something of a leader in Europe. The Annual Dinner, held in London, was attended by CEO's and other bigwigs from all around Europe and elsewhere – which frightened the pants off me, as I was expected to give a learned speech and I have a lifelong affliction of not being at all comfortable with speaking in public!

I was presented with a list of prominent Speakers I could invite to lighten up the evening, headed by Peter Ustinov at £25,000 plus expenses for an after-dinner speech. I knew that would be outside the BPF Budget! To save having the pants scared off me, I wore my kilt (!!) and decided to try Murray as my guest speaker.

In an absolutely charming reply, Murray explained that, for commercial dates, he sorted out the surfeit of invitations he received, to allow him some time at home, by selecting only those that met his published terms. Sadly, the BPF's budget fell short of this and, with some regret, he turned down my invitation. I understood his reckoning; Jackie Stewart gave me much the same explanation some time before. Nevertheless, when we next met Murray, he was effusive in his apologies. During this time, Murray still turned out for Marshals' Club activities and continued to heap praise on marshals in his commentaries.

When we hear people being described as "Icons of their sports", is there anyone more fitting to bear the title "Icon of Motorsport" than Murray Walker, OBE? I think not!

#### More Nostalgia

The last two nostalgic articles were about the Nurburgring so time to change the venue, but we will return there later. For now, let's look at Zandvoort in Holland.

Zandvoort is a lively seaside resort situated in the dunes not far from Amsterdam and the circuit there has existed for many years but fell off the GP Calendar when half the estate was sold off to allow a Holiday Park to be built. However, motor racing has continued there ever since and in 2020 it looked like F1 was about to return, but sadly Covid intervened, but they have a date on this year's calendar. It is very easy to get to; it's just a short hop across the Channel. My favourite route to Zandvoort would be to take an overnight ferry from Harwich to the Hook of Holland and drive up the coast, arriving in time on a Friday afternoon to unpack and walk to the circuit to join friends at the end of testing.

Alternatively, a flight from Heathrow to Schipol followed by a train ride to Zandvoort via Amsterdam can accomplish the journey in a day.

However, my first visit to Zandvoort was in 1989 courtesy of a trip arranged by the BRSCC, it was the last meeting to be held on the old Grand Prix circuit and featured all British races. About 30 BRSCC marshals met at Brands Hatch to board a coach and set off in convoy with the BRSCC double-decker hospitality bus for Holland. Everything went fine until we crossed the border into Holland, then cruising along the motorway with the bus in front we went under a bridge and sparks flew off the roof of the bus! It was too tall! The bus pulled over to the hard shoulder to inspect the damage and we pulled up behind. Luckily no one was hurt but poor Anne Rothburg was a bit shaken up, she was the only passenger on the bus. She decided to join us in the coach for the rest of the journey. So we set off again only to stop as we neared Schipol Airport. There were warning signs for a low tunnel where one of the airport runways and a canal crossed the motorway. The bus driver decided to park and wait for help so we continued without him and the bus. There was some consternation among the organisers, the bus was needed for hosting a barbecue that Saturday evening, invites had been sent to the Dutch marshals!

When we got to Zandvoort we booked into our hotel and had a tour of Amsterdam, that was interesting! Next morning we were taken by coach to the circuit where we found the hospitality bus. The police had escorted the bus off the motorway and all the way to the circuit; the driver was informed he should have purchased a high vehicle road map and planned his route accordingly, he was lucky not to be fined. We were allocated posts and we were bussed out to meet the Dutch marshals we would be working with. The Dutch are very hospitable and nearly all spoke English so we quickly fitted in. They delighted in trying to teach us some Dutch sayings which were not only difficult to pronounce but as we learned later were extremely rude! We already knew from TV commentary that Zandvoort was slippery because of the sand blowing off the dunes but what we hadn't appreciated was how narrow the circuit was and how rough the surface was. No wonder drivers complained about the lack of grip.

The BRSCC had decided to include Thunder Saloons in the race package they had brought over not realising that Zandvoort has a noise issue. Zandvoort has a limited number of noise days and this weekend was not one of them. A number of local residents have noise meters and the telephone number of the mayor and he has the power to close the meeting! The Dutch officials decreed that the Thunder saloons must be quieter so the teams made frantic efforts to stuff wire wool up exhausts to muffle the sound. This led to cars spitting out bundles of burning metal as they progressed around the track. Saturday evening we had a great barbecue and the beer flowed freely, the Dutch certainly know how to party. Sunday dawned and the weather was great, hot and sunny. British racing cars on an unfamiliar track led to many incidents and the time table was soon slipping behind. The organisers learnt that Zandvoort was one huge traffic jam. The good weather combined with the lure of motorsport resulted in massive crowds coming to the beaches and the racing. I now know this is not unusual at Zandvoort. We had a ferry to catch and it was beginning to look like we were not going to finish in time. Our coach driver

was advised to take the coach to Heerlen railway station and all the British marshals were collected from their posts and given train tickets to Heerlen. So we left while the racing was still going on. Despite all these precautions we did not get to Ostend in time to catch the ferry so we continued on to Calais where we managed to get on the first ferry on Monday morning. Arriving back at Brands Hatch tired and exhausted some of us had to get in their cars and head off to work!

Despite this inauspicious start my late wife Sue and I decided to return to Zandvoort for a second BRSCC trip the next year. On that occasion we had to make our own way there so we and a number of other marshals got in our cars and drove over. Unfortunately, when heading to the circuit we stopped at a red traffic light but the DHL truck behind us didn't. The car needed a new shell but that is another story. Still we enjoyed Zandvoort so much we joined the Officials Club Autosport (OCA) and regularly visited 3 - 4 times a year.
