The Chairman's Chatter.... Chris Whitlock - South Midlands Chairman....



Welcome to the Newsletter for

the South Midlands Region

Covid still hasn't gone away; in fact, I fear it will be something we have to live with for the foreseeable future. Each winter we could end up going through the same cycle of booster jabs and threats of restrictions to safeguard the vulnerable. At least this year England has been spared most of the restrictions, spare a thought for the Scots, Welsh and Irish colleagues who have had to contend with limitations to their festive celebrations. Covid has already impacted on motorsport in 2022 with the postponement of the Autosport show and the cancellation of Race Retro. At all times, please respect other peoples' wishes, maintain a social distance and if asked wear a mask especially in enclosed spaces. The postponement of Autosport International raises the question when will it take place? If it is not scheduled before the end of March they will have difficulty getting customers and exhibitors because the season will have started and their clientele will be engaged elsewhere. This raises the issue of where do we (BMMC South Mids) go to recruit new marshals? Traditionally we have had recruitment stands at the British Grand Prix, the Silverstone Classic, Kop Hill, Silverstone BTCC, and Motorsports Days Live. Personally, I wonder if we have scraped the bottom of the barrel with BTCC and the Classic; I have noticed a repetition of names and stand visitors from previous years and wonder if they are ever going to follow up their initial inquiries. Our biggest response follows the Grand Prix but that in itself presents problems; some of the approaches come from people living in the far reaches of the UK or even from overseas; the likelihood of them being able to regularly marshal at Silverstone is fairly remote. The number of taster day requests taken following the GP needs better management, but it is important to maintain our profile at the event. Persuading anyone to take up marshalling is a difficult task. Who wants to get up early in the morning, travel to a windy circuit to stand around in all weathers for eight plus hours, do nothing for 95% of the time but then risk their life for the remaining 5% and not get paid for it! At face value it is not that appealing. Despite this an analysis of the take up of marshalling from all inquiries in South Mids since 2012 shows that 20% were derived from recruitment events, 18% from taster/training days, but 29% (the largest group) were either returning marshals or were the result of a personal contact with an existing marshal. We are looking at new ways of approaching potential marshals and widening the scope of events we use but we need your support. As you can see from the analysis personal contacts work well so if you know anyone who might be interested in finding out what it is all about get them to get in touch at www.marshals.co.uk/membership.

It is now possible for anyone to register with Motorsport UK as a marshal; in fact, from 2023 it will become compulsory for all marshals to be registered. All they have to do is complete an application form and an online training module and they will be given a registration number. Once they have that number they can ask to marshal with any club. This could lead to an influx of untrained marshals; we need to be prepared for this. If you hold a trainee grade but have the required number of days under your belt you might consider upgrading now so we can differentiate those newbies from those of you with experience.

I've had a very quiet Christmas and New Year but now my thoughts are turning towards marshalling. As a member of SMT as well as BMMC I have completed my availability form for Silverstone; still planning a couple of weekends at Brands and elsewhere. However, I am surprised that Silverstone have not published their meetings; asking their members to keep the dates confidential despite some being publicised by the organising clubs. If they are not careful marshals will commit to meetings elsewhere. We have been informed that marshals will be invited to participate in a consultation about the new Marshals Pathway in the near future, when we know when this is taking place we will schedule another "Meet the Committee" Zoom meeting so you can ask your questions and present your views. In the meantime, Hugh Chambers has agreed to participate in a virtual Noggin & Natter in February, keep an eye open for the date via MailChimp, our web page and social media.

Secretary Scribblings

The South Midlands committee meets monthly, at present on the internet using Zoom, and all members are welcome to join us. Here is a summary of the topics that the committee have covered since the last Newsletter:

- feedback from the Virtual Taster Day sessions, which have so far been given to over 60 people (and counting) who had
 contacted BMMC and expressed an interest in marshalling. As we cannot offer any Taster Days in the winter, and we had a
 backlog of requests from the last two years when Covid had impacted our Taster Day plans, this presentation has been
 used to explain marshalling in some more detail. When the schedule is finished it will have delivered the presentation to all
 the people on our backlog, inviting them to our training if they are still interested in marshalling, and encouraging them to
 either start marshalling for themselves or put them on the list for a Taster Day once the season restarts;
- planning for physical Taster Days with the Silverstone team and reviewing what improvements could be made to how they
 are run so they are even more effective. For example, attendance has been lower than expected, with a disappointing
 number of "no-shows", so we are discussing a different invitation process to make sure that all places are filled;
- planning Recruitment stands for 2022. As well as considering our usual venues and events we have been analysing BMMC recruitment data from across the country to find out which type of events attract the most marshalling recruits, so we can focus our limited resources to reach the best number of potential new marshals;
- planning for marshals training in February 2022. The circuit training is to be a mix of virtual sessions for the theory modules and practical sessions for incident handling and fire training, which are again being held at Bedford Autodrome. In 2021 the theory sessions were really popular and we had a wider attendance than just our South Midlands region, as they were approved by Motorsport UK as qualifying for module signatures for upgrades. We are also planning Kart training for the first time, to be hosted by Hunts Kart Racing Club at Kimbolton, where both theory and practical sessions will be delivered on site;
- welcomed two newly certified Motorsport UK Trainers to our team of regional trainers, in Keith Madderson and Marion Quarrington, who will both be delivering courses at our training events;
- welcomed Ian Whiting to our Committee as Regional Grading Officer following the well-earned retirement of Malcolm Flippance. There will be a lot of discussions soon around grading as we learn more about the New Marshal's Pathway, and we will be hosting some Zoom calls to gather feedback on the proposals, just as soon as the full scope of the proposals is sent out for consultation;
- following up on some points raised by our members at our "Meet the Committee" Noggin and Natter regarding marshalling conditions at Silverstone. Meetings with the Silverstone team are being arranged to carry these points forward;
- planning further Virtual and Live Noggin and Natters, to run alongside the "physical" meetings which have been organised by Bob Sketchley. Our next confirmed "virtual" speaker is Hugh Chambers, who is CEO of Motorsport UK and a recent attendee on a Silverstone Taster Day! We shall open up the applications to join as soon as we can agree a date in his busy schedule.

Please let me know if there is anything you would like us to discuss so I can add it to the agenda, but please let me know at least a week before the meeting. The dates for 2022 are below, all are on a Monday evening, and the meeting starts at 19:45. If you want to join us at the meeting please send me an e-mail no later than 2 days before the meeting on <u>sm.secretary@marshals.co.uk</u>, along with your membership number and the e-mail address you will be joining from, and I will send you the joining instructions

New Trainee Marshals

I have spoken to MSUK and they have confirmed that Trainee marshals who have recently registered with Motorsport UK, and have completed the on-line modules, are not being issued with Personal Record Cards (PRCs) – "*the little blue book"*. Instead, they will have to download the record sheets on an A4 document on which to record their attendances. The reason, as part of the New Marshal Pathway, to be introduced during 2022.

Once all of the online modules have been completed, MSUK will then issue the MSUK card, all trainees are now referred to as Registered Marshal (Accredited).

Please ensure that once you have attended an event or training day, you obtain a signature from the Post Chief or Stage Controller, along with comments of your participation.

BMMC South Midlands Region Committee invited their members to join them in a "Meet Your Committee" on 17th November 2021 as a Q&A session for all things marshalling. Nadine Lewis (National Chair) was also on the panel, and what follows is a summary of the questions and the answers.

Chris Whitlock (South Midlands Region Chair) introduced himself and invited all the Committee Members to introduce themselves and give a brief outline of their marshalling career. Present were Adrian Cashmore (Treasurer and Regalia), Glynn Ellis (Recruitment and Volunteering), Keith Madderson (Social Media), Emile Naus (Web Admin), Steve Morris (Membership Secretary) and Marion Quarrington (Secretary). Also present were Malcolm Flippance (Grading, but retired at recent AGM) and Chris Gwilliam (Regional Sprint and Hillclimb rep). Chris W introduced Nadine Lewis who also gave an outline of her marshalling career. The members who had joined the webex also introduced themselves.

Silverstone has a big problem with a lack of Post Chiefs, and also Flag Marshals, and with more events being held on the Grand Prix Circuit it becomes more of an issue. What is BMMC doing about this? BMMC cannot force marshals to upgrade to Post Chief, and there are some Post Chiefs and Flag Marshals who will not marshal at Silverstone. Silverstone is unique by having both Incident Officers and Post Chiefs, other circuits tend to only have Post Chiefs. At Silverstone the Incident team is often not co-located with the Flag Marshals and the Post Chief, so they can be left marshalling on their own for an entire weekend. There also may be a contribution from the post allocations for the Incident Team and for the other roles being done by different people, such that a surfeit of people volunteered for Incident will not be considered for re-allocation to the other roles, which can then be left under-staffed. If the allocations were done together then potential gaps would be recognised and people approached to take another role for the relevant event. Nadine and Chris agreed that they would discuss how to approach Silverstone Marshals Team and the management at Silverstone to try to resolve the issue. It was generally agreed that the number of events that are held on the same dates, combined with marshals always attending their favourite events, means that some events are over-populated (eg Race of Remembrance and Walter Hayes Trophy) whilst others struggle to get sufficient numbers.

Why are some Flag Posts impossible to flag from, eg the flags hit the tyre wall or flags are not seen from neighbouring posts? And why are some posts included on the track license for a circuit configuration when they are only used on other configurations?

Nadine stated that she has examples of this from all circuits and it has already been raised with MotorSport UK (MSUK), who have agreed to change the process for their track safety inspections so that there will always be people stationed on adjoining posts whenever MSUK look at an individual marshal's post. This will ensure that post-to-post sightings will be checked as well the features of the post under scrutiny. MSUK have said they want to walk the circuit with the Circuit Rep plus at least two other people when they do their inspections.

What is being done to improve the BMMC Personal Accident insurance for major injuries?

The BMMC has Personal Accident Insurance as a "top-up" to the MSUK insurance, for all events that are operating under MSUK permits. It also has a separate Personal Accident Insurance policy for non-MSUK events, both in UK and when marshalling abroad. Historically the benefits from the MSUK policy have not always tracked increases in the UK cost of living, and the BMMC policies, which have tracked the MSUK policies, have also fallen behind. Steve Woolfe is currently reviewing all the insurance policies, and will be reporting back to Council.

What is happening with the new grading scheme?

The New Pathway is still being planned and discussed. Nadine is on the Marshals Advisory Group, which is the body leading the changes, and they will be meeting monthly from January to finalise the details. The first change has been made, such that new rally marshals who have completed the on-line course are now called Registered Accredited Marshals, and new marshals in all the other disciplines are called Registered Marshals. During 2022 all active marshals will be strongly encouraged by MSUK to register with them with the expectation that all people who marshal at MSUK events will be at least Registered Marshals by the end of 2022. The next planned change is expected to be to the Examining Grades, which is likely to become an Assessor Role. As for the timing of this and all the rest of the changes, it is hoped that all discussions will concluded in 2022 so that people will port across from the current to their new roles when they renew their MSUK licenses towards the end of 2022.

There was a lively and wide-ranging discussion on many aspects of upgrading, including commenting on those areas which do and do not work at present, and on possible changes which might improve matters. Nadine stressed that, once the proposals are clearer from MSUK, these will be put out for consultation, and BMMC plans to ask all their members for comments. The below are some of the points discussed, and Nadine agreed to take the comments back to the MAG:

- Why can't there be a dual upgrade requirement for marshals to have both attendance signatures and signatures for demonstrating competencies in core skills, such as dressing oil, or pushing a car from a live circuit. This would help to provide a consistent set of core skills which the Assessor will use for standardisation?
- Will Assessors be performing a dual role on the day, ie will they also have a marshalling role as well as doing an assessment?
- What will Examiners become if they chose not to apply to be Assessors?
- What will happen to "practised" marshals who want to move across to another discipline? Will they have to go back to the beginning of that new discipline or do they move across at the grade they are already?
- What incentive is there to upgrade if all new marshals are now called "Registered Marshal"?
- Why are new Registered Marshals not being issued with a PRC?
- Where do signatures go for events such as Driving Tests which do not have a recognised discipline?
- Under the new scheme who will be able to sign for attendance signatures?

The MSUK website is difficult to access, and navigation is not intuitive. Also, it is not clear for very new marshals exactly what you should do - join BMMC, register with MSUK, volunteer for an event, and then electronically sign on for it, all using different websites and different log-ons. Can this all be made much more simple please?

At present these are all different organisations and there is no single website that covers everything. On top of that, each organising club will handle the sign-on differently, there is no chance in the short term of getting this streamlined, and some clubs are better than others at sign-posting what you need to do to sign-on. MSUK is aware its website could be better and is working on an update. Also, Silverstone is having trouble with its IT system in this area and this has impacted how SMT has issued QR codes. Nadine agreed that BMMC have not been good at helping brand new marshals to navigate through how things are done.

Some marshals have complained that they have volunteered for an event through the BMMC Volunteering site but they haven't received joining instructions and the Chief Marshal has not known that they were coming. Can this be improved please?

There have been no complaints received by BMMC, so we cannot investigate why this might be happening. Nadine is aware of some very specific problems but not in South Mids region. If anyone hears of any problems in the future then please make the Volunteering Co-ordinator aware so it can be investigated and fixed.
