1. CHAIR REPORT

At last in 2022 we were freed from the constraints of Covid, but we were still facing the consequences.

- Committee Matters. Following the resignation of Malcolm Flippance as Regional Grading Officer at the AGM in October 2020 we were faced with one vacant committee place to fill. At the AGM Ian Whiting expressed an interest in joining the committee and after attending a meeting as a guest agreed to take on the Grading Officer role. He faced a steep learning curve and the prospect of understanding a whole new grading structure with the new Marshals Pathway and, with some initial help from Malcolm, has dealt with the challenges admirably. For the first time in three years we started 2022 with a full committee. I am really pleased at how well this committee is working together as a team. I have attended nine committee meetings this year; one meeting was cancelled because not enough of the committee could attend to make it quorate, however we did receive reports from all members. This year we have organised two zoom Noggin & Natter evenings; one in March with Hugh Chambers and one in July with Peter Roberts. Attendance numbers were down on previous events; is this down to the quality of the guests or because everyone is a bit Zoomed out? We are happy to continue with these events if you let us know who you want to see; but be realistic and we will see what we can achieve.
- Members. Surprisingly regional membership has remained almost static as I am sure Steve will report. I say surprisingly because we are aware of an overall drop in numbers due to marshals not returning to the sport after Covid. We are all aware that a number of colleagues did not make it; our sympathies and condolences go to their families and friends. In March I undertook what I hope will be an annual exercise of ringing round the South Mids members to find out how they are coping. Please make sure your contact details are kept up to date. Following last year's AGM we invited our members to two Meet the Committee Zoom meetings, the second to discuss the proposals for the New Marshals Pathway. They were quite lively events!
- **Council Matters.** I have attended all three BMMC Council meetings held so far this year, a fourth will be held before the National AGM. There has been a very full agenda at every meeting. The new

Marshals Pathway has been very challenging largely because detailed information about it was slow in emerging. The series of Zoom meetings led by our National Chair Nadine helped clarify expectations and the Motorsport UK consultation has resulted in something more acceptable. We have also been investigating how we might self-fund training in the light of significantly reduced support from the British Motor Sport Training Trust and how we can improve the data quality of our membership data base and volunteering database to facilitate members volunteering for events. The BTCC experiment in using light signals instead of flags has been quite contentious leading to a Lights Vs Flags debate which has led to a long exchange of emails. Our National Secretary has commenced a review of the Club's Articles & Rules with a view to rationalising them. Finally, we are examining what contribution the Club might make to "Racing with Respect" and "Environment Conservation" initiatives put forward by Motorsport UK.

Finally, it is with deep sorrow that we say good bye to two stalwarts of the Club; George Copeland our erstwhile former Treasurer and past Chairman of South Midlands and Eric Ridler our National Regalia Officer who both passed away in August; may they rest in peace.

3. SECRETARY REPORT

The South Midlands Regional Committee has continued to meet monthly by Zoom, with the exception of December 2021 where we did not have a meeting and April 2022 when we reviewed reports by email.

 Reporting Committee business to the Members. I have enhanced my contributions to the Newsletter to include a more detailed overview of the Committee business, so that Members are aware of what the Committee does on their behalf.

- Virtual Noggin and Natters. South Midlands Region has organised and hosted two Virtual Noggin and Natters during 2022, with total requests to attend in excess of 50 seats. As Regional Secretary I have done all the admin for these events, including preparing and publishing a summary of the event.
- Virtual Meetings. South Midlands Region has hosted two Virtual Regional Meetings during 2022.
 The first was a "Meet Your Committee" and the second was a forum on the Motorsport UK
 proposals on the New Marshals Pathway. The latter proved to be a feisty event, as it was held not
 long after the first set of proposals were published, and the meeting was a challenge to administer.
 As Regional Secretary I have done all the admin for these events.
- Regional Secretary role. John Edwards, National Secretary, holds periodic Zoom meetings with the
 Regional Secretary team, where we share knowledge on our role and the various tasks involved,
 and propose improvements. Through this forum I have gained wider knowledge on how to conduct
 Zoom meetings and proposed some changes to the way in which the BMMC File Server is
 organised, as well as helped to on-board two new Regional Secretaries.
- General admin and support. General Regional admin is up to date, and, as a license holder for the BMMC Zoom account, I have facilitated various regional activities including hosting some virtual training sessions. I also managed the "front of house" and refreshments for one of the Regional Training events in February, and I have organised this 2022 AGM and End of Season Dinner.

5. MEMBERSHIP REPORT

Post Covid 19 restrictions saw the return for our 'Trainee' Marshals (soon to be referred to as 'Registered') back to circuits and Marshalling duties, and also saw a welcome return to Physical Taster Days, where by close of the year, we will have managed to show © 55 people how we live our life in Orange at Silverstone.

We had filled the gap before we could restart Physical Taster Days by giving potential new marshals a "virtual" understanding of marshalling by inviting them to a Virtual Taster Day presentation developed and delivered over Zoom by Tony Apsion, Nina Fountain and myself, and including plenty of Q&A. A number of potential trainees were able to use this to decide to sign up as marshals, and we have seen them at circuits and join BMMC.

As Membership Secretary, I feel I should also note the passing of George Copeland, who played a significant role in the history, and shaping of the club.

Our (South Midlands) membership numbers have increased slightly over the year from 237 in November 2021 to 252 in September 2022, and we still remain at around the 10% of the total club membership.

6. VOLUNTEERING REPORT

2022 was by far a more normal year when it comes to events and marshalling than 2020 or 2021, although the number of members using our volunteering web site to volunteer for events in our South Midlands Region is still way below pre covid times. Generally, I have found a lot of new starters / trainees using our system but certainly not as frequently as pre covid times.

This year Silverstone have put out more appeals for additional marshals than in previous years with some meetings running with considerable fewer marshals than is ideal. However, for the first time to my knowledge in 2022 Silverstone rejected a number of trainee marshals from their September BTCC meeting due to the number volunteering for the event. I was told the number volunteering for this event on the National circuit exceeded the volunteer list for the British GP. Obviously an excessive number of marshals on any particular post can be more of a safety issue than too few so a decision had to be made, unfortunately it was aimed at trainees who are mainly in their first year of marshalling. I hope for 2023 this issue can be resolved more amicably as a lot of time, effort and expense goes into recruiting these members initially.

- BMMC South Midlands have processed four upgrade applications.
- Five 'Grading Gripes' articles were prepared and published in the South Midlands region bi-monthly Newsletters.
