#### Chairman's Chatter

At the end of March Nadine will be sending out a final reminder to all BMMC members that have not renewed their membership. That message will inform those members that at the end of April they will be removed from the membership database, and they will cease to be members of the club.

Sadly, as I write some 30 members of South Midlands region have failed to renew their membership. Some will have left because they have decided to retire, some because in the current financial crisis they can no longer afford to, and some because after a couple of years their circumstances have changed, and they have decided that marshalling does not fit their lifestyle. And others just have not got around to renewing.



For the latter group I say GET ON WITH IT! This is your last chance, complete your renewal before the end of March and you will still be entered for the Grand Prize Draw A day out at Bedford Autodrome. For those of you that feel you no longer wish to continue as members of BMMC I hope that you have enjoyed your marshalling experience with us and if you ever change your mind you will always be welcome.

You will recall that in February John Edwards our National Secretary wrote to you announcing the setting up of a National Governance Working Group (GWG) to carry out a "Root and Branch" review of the Club's Articles and Rules to make sure we meet our legal responsibilities. One thing we have discovered is that we have a legal responsibility to inform all members of matters regarding the governance of the Club such as Annual General Meetings. Some 800 members have unsubscribed from MailChimp the clubs email distribution system of choice and as such this presents a problem. John's notice about the GWG had to be delivered by Royal Mail to those 800 members at a cost that is unsustainable. To meet our legal obligations we need to find a way of sending these legal notices to those unsubscribers by email. Unfortunately we cannot just add them to the MailChimp distribution; they have to re-subscribe themselves!

In January Nadine launched a search for a Zero Hero in every region in support of the Motorsport UK/FIA Action for Environment initiative. I am pleased to announce that Annette Benson has volunteered to be the BMMC South Midlands region "Zero Hero" and has been co-opted onto the committee. You will be hearing more from Annette as the role develops.

Our new National Regalia Officer has asked do we need **BMMC Membership Cards?** Traditionally we have used our membership cards to prove we were eligible to attend AGMs but with them being held as hybrid events (virtually and physically present) membership is checked via the data base. Our status as a marshal is supported by the Motorsport UK registration card. So do we need them? Andrew Liddiment has put forward the following options: No Membership Cards; Cards for everyone (as now); or Cards only for those members who want one. Andrew will be ordering next year's cards (if any) from a sustainable supplier in July and will want to discuss at the June Board meeting. Please let me have your thoughts on this.

Talking about Regalia, Adrian now has a credit card reader and will soon have new items to sell from sustainable sources. Teamwear will continue to be provided via BestWorkwear from the regalia catalogue on the website and a new supplier DREAD will also be set up on the website.

Finally, we are asked if we want to change the charity BMMC supports in 2024. We currently support Race Against Dementia, it has been suggested that we might opt to support one of the following instead: Mission Motorsport; Speed of Sight; or Prostate Cancer – Your votes please.

#### **Grading Gripes**

Greetings everyone, I hope you have are all looking forward to a fun filled and action packed season ahead.

As you are probably fully aware this year will see the proposed changes in relation to the grading system.

The new Pathway will be implemented at the end of June 2023.

I would like to remind everyone that the upgrade process is laid out in the PRC with the number of days required and how many training days are needed.

As mentioned in the previous newsletter

Here are some of the common reasons why upgrades have to be referred.

- 1. No marshal registration form (MRF) supplied. These are available at MSUK under marshals-resources.
- 2. Dual duties recorded and counted towards upgrade. Dual duties are not able to be used and you must only record the 1 duty for the day.
- **3.** Incorrect training signatures. Some upgrades such as experienced grades require 2 training days which must be at least 1 year apart.
- **4.** Time expired signatures. Attendance signatures are valid for 3 years and training for 2 years. Please remember that we must all attend training days every 2 years or bi-annually.
- **5.** Non completion of all modules for training signatures.

Don't forget to get your upgrades in and if you need advice before submitting then please do drop me a line.

In addition to Marion's Comments regarding the acquired rights process, here is a summary below of how this works.

As part of the new Marshals' Development Pathway, Motorsport UK has set up an acquired rights process to enable those who may not have previously registered, or have chosen not to upgrade, to have their knowledge, skills and experience recognised by a more suitable grade of registration.

To qualify for a higher grade of registration under the acquired rights scheme, you must supply the information detailed to your Club, who will then complete the necessary Club declaration or nomination letter and forward all of the documents to Motorsport UK. Acquired rights applications will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

Applications under this scheme must be submitted to Motorsport UK by the 31st December 2023

# Using the Motorsport UK Acquired Rights Scheme

As part of the transition to the New Marshals Pathway, Motorsport UK has created an Acquired Rights scheme. The goal is to enable marshals to be recognised for their skills, knowledge and experience and to be registered at the most appropriate grade. The Acquired Rights scheme is aimed at marshals who have not previously registered, those who have chosen not to upgrade or those who have been unable to upgrade due to circumstances outside their control (for example, lack of Examining Marshals in their discipline, such as in Rally or Kart, or lack of Examining Post Chiefs at some circuits). The scheme is being offered as part of the introduction of the New Marshals Pathway and will only be available until the end of 2023. Each application is treated on its own merits, and guidance on what qualifies and how to apply is available from the Resources section of the Motorsport UK website under "Marshals" and "Marshals' Acquired Rights Scheme".

Our Regional Secretary, Marion Quarrington, has recently used the Acquired Rights scheme to apply for a Speed grade, and here's what she says about it.

IW: Why did you want to use the Acquired Rights scheme?

**MQ:** I was a graded Specialist, and a little-known quirk of the previous grading system allowed attendance signatures for marshalling in the paddock and start line for Speed events to be given either under the Speed discipline or the Specialist discipline. I typically do about 8-10 days a year in Speed event paddocks but had received all my signatures as a Specialist and had never registered as a Speed marshal. The New Pathway has transferred the Specialist role to Race Off-Track and rolled the Off-Track Speed roles solely into the Speed discipline, so I wanted to have my existing Speed experience recognised with an appropriate grade.

IW: How did you set about applying?

**MQ:** The guidance on the Motorsport UK website shows that you need to have four things, a list of the qualifying events that you have done, up-to-date training signatures for the role you are applying for, and a declaration or letter of recommendation from your marshalling club. You also need to have completed the basic marshal on-line accreditation course. The first thing I did was to check with Motorsport UK that my position meant that I could use the Acquired Rights scheme, because all of that is a lot of work if you then find out you can't use the process after all! **IW:** What was their answer?

**MQ:** I was told that my situation was a good example of what the Acquired Rights scheme was designed to cover and I should go ahead and apply.

IW: So what happened next?

MQ: Now it was back to my records. I could easily draw up the list of the events back to 2018, as I had the signatures in my Specialist PRC and I had made a note of the few events where I had been marshalling on the bank at Speed events and not in the paddock. I had been told that I could just list everything I had done and didn't need to also have all the signatures, but as I had most of them, I scanned them anyway as extra support for the application. I had some of the relevant in-date training signatures, as I had all the common modules such as fire and FMOS from my Specialist training in the last few years. However, I needed to get the Speed-specific training signatures as well, so I booked on the BARC Speed training event at Gurston Down in January and so got a full set of training signatures. Meanwhile I had a chat with the Chief Marshal at Prescott, where I do the majority of my Hill Climb marshalling, and we agreed what Speed Grade he thought I should have and gave me a letter of recommendation for it. Once I had all of the paperwork sorted out I sent the whole lot electronically, with a covering email, to Motorsport UK.

IW: And you were successful?

**MQ:** Yes, absolutely. I had an email acknowledgement of my application within a few days, and a couple of weeks later an email saying that my application had been successful, and I was being awarded the grade I had applied for. Two weeks after that my new Registration Card arrived in the post with the extra grade listed! I have since marshalled with another BMMC member who has used the process to get a kart grade after marshalling for a number of years without upgrading, and they had the same good experience as I did. We both agreed it was all so straightforward, and that we would recommend it to anyone in a similar situation.

We covered various modules throughout the day and spent several hours outside practicing some real-life scenarios.












After we ran our day over at Bedford we ran a few more virtual sessions over zoom, allowing us to assist marshals from across the UK.

#### **Wanted Training Officer**

We are still looking for a new Training Officer for BMMC South Midlands Region following Matt Turner's decision to stand down this year. Matt has promised to provide guidance and help to whoever replaces him however he just does not have the time to continue in the role himself. Ideally, we would welcome one of our regular trainers if they want to fill the vacancy but we would also consider anyone else who wants to step forward; you do not need to be a Motorsport UK licensed Trainer. If you wish to become a Licensed Trainer, we would be willing to sponsor you.

The Training Officer Role is as follows:

**Objectives** • To provide Members with appropriate training in line with Motorsport UK and BMMC requirements, in a timely way.

#### **Actions**

- Identify regional training needs.
- Organise regional training events including identifying/liaising with appropriate venues and providers.
- Forecast and track all costs, and co-ordinate with National Training Officer to apply for funding as appropriate.
- Complete all necessary venue documentation (eg Risk Assessment, Method Statement etc) and ensure compliance with BMMC Public Liability Insurance cover.
- Identify and co-ordinate with appropriate Trainers to deliver the required sessions/modules to Motorsport UK requirements as necessary.
- Collate feedback and submit to National Training Officer for MSUK.
- Ensure appropriate training material is available and can be shared throughout the year.
- Attend and contribute to Committee Meetings and AGM, provide reports, and complete assigned actions.
- Communicate to Members in person and via newsletter contributions as appropriate.
- Participate in Regional activities to promote BMMC and member satisfaction as appropriate.
- Submit expenses promptly using National procedure.
- Skills Must be familiar with MSUK Grading requirements, and in particular the training elements required.
- Must be familiar with MSUK Training requirements, to verify that proposed training material supplied by the Trainers is compliant.
- Must be able to contact and negotiate with venues and service providers to book training events.
- Must be familiar with requirements for venue hire, and be able to complete Risk Assessments, Method Statements etc as required by the venue organiser.
- Must be familiar with the compliance requirements of BMMC Public Liability Insurance cover. Must be able to co-ordinate with service providers to ensure they complete Risk Assessments, Method Statements etc as required by the venue organiser, and provide their own liability insurance as required.
- Must be familiar with Microsoft Office, Word & Excel, and popular web-based conferencing facilities.
- Must be proactive and self-motivating.
- Must be a good communicator both verbally and in writing. Qualifications
- Preferred to be an MSUK Registered Trainer.
- Must be a Member of BMMC.
- Must be elected to and/or supported by Regional Committee.
- Must be an active or recently retired marshal.

The above role description looks fairly daunting, but in fact the job is largely administrative, you do not have to give presentations or lectures. Good organisational skills and an outgoing personality are essential. Motorsport UK will provide help and advice and most of the training modules.


#### Best All Round Dedication to the Sport
