## Chairman's Chatter

Well we got back home on 28<sup>th</sup> March as planned and the house was still standing and the cars were still on the drive! There was a mountain of post to be dealt with and it has taken a couple of weeks to catch up with emails. I am glad that I managed to draft the March contribution to this column before I went on holiday.

On my return I also found that my diary had filled up! On 3<sup>rd</sup> April I had a Teams meeting with Silverstone to discuss the new accreditation system for non-SMT marshals to access the circuit. It seems that the Health & Safety Executive are requiring all people who work at Silverstone to read and sign an online induction before they will be given access to the site.

This new accreditation system affects all members of BMMC that wish to marshal at Silverstone; the fact the induction looks like it has been lifted from a building site makes no sense at all.

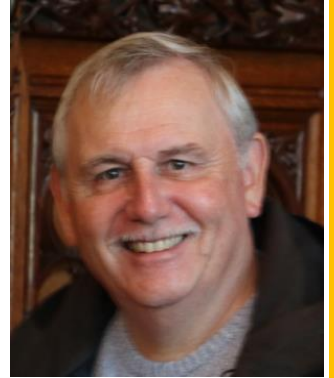
On 9<sup>th</sup> April I attended a BMMC Governance Working Group (GWG) meeting charged with revising BMMC policies and ended up being tasked with Mike Sargeant (SW Secretary) to drafting a Corporate Risk Assessment Policy.

On 24<sup>th</sup> April I was booked into a Zoom Meeting to discuss a letter from BARC that proposed that they would undertake marshal recruitment at BTCC events. It has been suggested that their marshalling numbers are down.

On 30<sup>th</sup> April there was another GWG meeting to review the draft policies with the aim of seeking BMMC Board approval on 19<sup>th</sup> June. I was tasked with drawing up a draft Risk Register with a couple of draft "risks"; I circulated this on 7<sup>th</sup> May.

On 7<sup>th</sup> May I chaired the South Mids Committee meeting. We interviewed Nina Fountain who has applied for the vacant Trainer's post. We were all impressed by her credentials and subsequent to the meeting Nina agreed to take the post; her position will be ratified at the regional AGM.

Since my return I have attended three meetings at Silverstone; 13<sup>th</sup> April MSVR, 27<sup>th</sup> April GTs, and 4<sup>th</sup> May International Trophy. This year I have mainly volunteered for one day of a two-day meeting. The MSVR meeting was the smoothest, but I am glad I was not there on the Sunday for a 3 hour C1 race with a very low grid. There was some confusion at the GT meeting with some marshals being allocated the wrong duties or even duties that do not exist at Silverstone (Paddock). There was also some confusion on the allocation of posts, as Post Chief I was sent to Luffield Centre, not Luffield Outside; this left a light panel without an operator (the Flag at Centre needed guidance only his second day flagging). The International Trophy was a sad reflection of past events given this accolade. The International Trophy was originally a non-championship Formula 1 race. I remember one such race in the 70s; it was won by Keke Rosberg in a Theodore (I think). It was pouring with rain throughout the race. It started with two warm up laps because of the weather. On his first lap Ronnie Peterson spun his Lotus 78 at Woodcote; on his second lap Ronnie was obviously not happy with his first effort, he tried even harder and completely destroyed the car in the catch fencing at Woodcote. Nicki Lauda's Ferrari came to a muddy end in the ploughed field at farm. He refused to leave the car until a marshal gave him a piggy back ride out of the mud. This year's International ended with a two car twenty minute race between a Chevron and a Renault Clio laughably referred to racing closely by Fay; they were on the same lap; someone questioned Fay's definition of close. It was a Farce of a meeting. I hope no one received the Trophy.

## Secretary Scribblings

The South Midlands committee meets on alternate months, at present on the internet using Zoom, and all members are welcome to join us. Please see the meeting calendar below. Here is a summary of some of the topics that the committee has covered since the last Newsletter:

- The May committee meeting was attended by Nina Foutain, who had applied for the role of Regional Training Co-Ordinator. Many of you will know Nina from BRSCC meetings, and from delivering training for both BMMC and BRSCC. In times past she has also been a member of the South Midlands Regional committee. We are delighted to tell you that Nina has taken up the role and been co-opted to the committee with immediate effect. She will be a valuable asset to the committee and to the level of training in the region. On a wider note BMMC has also welcomed Alan Page as National Training Co-Ordinator, and he will be working with all the Regional Co-Ordinators to strengthen our training offering.
- Received a report on the new recruitment initiative at Bicester Scramble. We were given a prime location outside Motorsport UK offices, with Dawn Butcher, a BMMC ambassador, bringing her GTI race car on display. Footfall was brisk in the morning, with a lot of leaflets handed out, and we have been invited back for the next Scramble on October 6<sup>th</sup>.
- Marshal recruitment at the British Grand Prix is being co-ordinated by Motorsport UK, who will have a very large stand advertising participation in all forms of motorsport and not just volunteering. At the time of our last meeting we had not had any details of this, but Glynn has subsequently sent out information asking for people interested in helping to get in touch.
- BMMC was contacted by BARC about marshal recruitment at BTTC events. For a number of years this has been managed exclusively by BMMC on behalf of the whole marshalling community, but BARC now want to spearhead.
- Received a report that Silverstone may be willing to assist with tickets etc to enable us to re-start Taster Days, which we had to reluctantly stop during 2023. After our meeting Chris had a conversation with Silverstone and confirmed that we should indeed be able to restart soon, and Kaz is busy contacting all the people on our Taster Day list to see who is still interested. - Received some more information about the accreditation process at Silverstone for visiting marshals. It appears that the process was triggered after an in-field incident which resulted in Silverstone needing to ensure all people working at the venue had had a Safety Induction before entering the site. Silverstone had included visiting marshals in their definition of "working", and used marshals volunteering through BMMC to test out the system. It has now been agreed that BMMC marshals will not be asked to use the accreditation process.

Please let me know if there is anything you would like the Committee to discuss so I can add it to the agenda, but please let me know at least 2 weeks before the meeting. The dates for 2024 are below and the meeting starts at 19:45. # Impending Vacancy

Our South Midlands Regional Chair, Chris Whitlock, has given notice to the Committee that he will be retiring from the role with effect from the AGM in October. We shall therefore be seeking a new Regional Chair for South Midlands Region. This note is to let you know how and when applications for the role will be advertised, and how you will be able to apply if you are interested.

Following from the adoption of the new Articles of Association and Club Rules last year, the Regional Chair is now elected directly by the regional members, and there is a process and a timetable for this to happen. The process is to be run entirely electronically, so please make sure that we hold your up-to-date email details so that you can take part.

The first formal communication will be sent out by email in August, and will be the official Notice of the Vacancy. This will include the application form, the process for applying and the deadline for candidates to submit their application form. To be eligible to stand a marshal must be affiliated to the South Midlands region, hold a grade of at least Grade 1 in any of the Motorsport UK marshalling disciplines, and have marshalled at least one event in the previous year. If there is only one eligible candidate when the deadline passes then they will be declared elected as Regional Chair without the need for any voting. Should more than one eligible candidate step forward then there will be an election, which will start when the details of the candidates are sent out to the members, along with the voting procedure and the date when the voting closes. The successful candidate will be announced once the election has closed and the votes have been counted. The new Regional Chair will be ratified at the AGM.

For anyone who is thinking of standing for this role I have put the role statement for the South Midlands Regional Chair on the next page, so you can see what it entails. In addition to the regional responsibilities all Regional Chairs are also Directors of British Motorsport Marshals' Club Limited, which carries with it certain legal responsibilities under the Companies Act 2006. It is very strongly recommended that anyone who is considering standing for the role has a chat with an existing Director to make sure they understand the obligations of being a Director, so please contact Chris at [sm.chair@marshals.co.uk](mailto:sm.chair@marshals.co.uk), or the National Secretary John Edwards at [nat.secretary@marshals.co.uk](mailto:nat.secretary@marshals.co.uk) or any of the other Regional Directors.
