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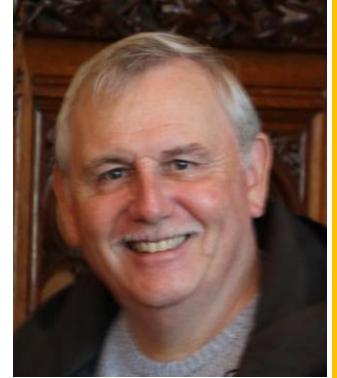

Chairman's Chatter

I expect by now you will have seen the email about volunteering to marshal for Moto GP but did you take note of the request that if you wanted to do the meeting you would have to read a "Volunteers on Line Induction" and only when you had completed that would you be accredited to go on site. I suspect those of you who have no interest in bikes will have binned the email while others might be wondering if they should complete the induction. In fact Silverstone want everyone who works at the circuit to complete an induction and there are currently four inductions to choose from. So What is it all about and why are we being asked to do this? After a Zoom meeting with Silverstone this is what I have learnt.



There are two reasons why inductions are required; the first is the result of a HSE investigation into an incident in 2023. HSE have decided that because there could be a number of hazardous activities being undertaken simultaneously at Silverstone everyone working there must complete a H&S induction and a record is kept that they have done so. The second is because of a pending/proposed piece of legislation known as Martyn's Law that requires any large venue to have counter terrorism measures in place. As Silverstone has a higher capacity than 900 people it falls in the upper echelon of venues.

The first induction looked as if had been written for a building site and it was quickly realised that it was not exactly appropriate for the office workers and the volunteers on site (Marshals, Racemakers etc.). So there are now four specific inductions; a general H&S induction aimed at third party contractors; an International Paddock induction for people working around the Wing, Pits and Paddock; a Staff induction aimed at all Silverstone employees and a Volunteers (marshals/race makers etc).

I was concerned about the haphazard way this induction process was being managed. Glynn Ellis our volunteering coordinator, was approached by Silverstone to arrange for BMMC members who volunteered to marshal at Silverstone but who were not members of SMT to complete the original "building site" induction. Glynn was sending the induction to those marshals and informing SMT he had done so. Before she resigned Nadine told Glynn that he should not be doing this, if marshals needed to complete inductions the organising club should arrange for this when names were passed to them. As it turned out at that time no organising club was asked to get their marshals inducted they were sent tickets for the number of marshals they were providing.

In my Zoom meeting with Silverstone in April it was confirmed that HSE were insisting that all workers would need to complete an induction. The current arrangements were an experiment using BMMC as guinea pigs (without formally notifying us!) and it was HSE's intention to roll this out to all race circuits in the long run. It was only then that Martyn's Law was mentioned. Once marshals had completed the induction their details would be added to the same portal at Silverstone as SMT members and they would be given a permanent annual pass. When marshals volunteer for a meeting a list is prepared of all the marshals attending and only those passes will be recognised by the scanners on the gate. This might help explain why we have been given three different passes this year.

Now that some marshals have completed their inductions and others have read them I have received a number of comments questioning the meaning of the wording in the induction and some sections cropped up repeatedly. I have raised these with Silverstone and their responses are as follows:

Section 2 Personal Safety - Always wear the provided Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) - PPE wise it is not specific to what you must wear as it details "Always wear the provided Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) when working in designated areas." So that refers to what PPE you have been issued by your organisation in this case that would be none as MSUK do not mandate any form of PPE. *(Some marshals questioned provided PPE – who provides? But as Motorsport UK does not mandate a minimum standard this response is valid)*

Only conduct shift activities that you have been trained how to perform - I argued that marshalling is a continuously developing process with progress measured by grade. Marshals should not be allocated tasks they haven't qualified for without supervision but are free to refuse tasks they feel uncomfortable with. Silverstone responded We can get the training section changed I am happy with that.

All staff as a minimum MUST wear the provided "Silverstone Team" high visibility vests/clothing while walking around site. – I argued not all marshals are members of SMT and do not have "Team" Hi Vis vests. Silverstone responded The Silverstone Team high Vis as mentioned happy to change it.

Section 3 Hot Works Fire - In the event of a fire all persons are to immediately leave the area and congregate at the nearest assembly point, Do not attempt to fight a fire – I argued it is a marshals job to fight fires and they are trained accordingly. Silverstone responded: The Fire safety section is still relevant as I believe it is clear enough to marshal that there is a difference to trackside fires and public area fires. Just because marshals fight fires on circuit safely does not mean they are exempt from being told the process for reacting to fires on other areas of the site as there is a different process, they need to be made aware of.

Section 5 General Safety and NEVER walk backwards.- I argued that we are taught to watch the approaching traffic and sometimes we had to walk backwards. Silverstone replied agree in terms of walking backwards we will edit this.

And finally:

On your point of accreditation and site inductions this is a process we are rolling out over all events in the coming years as you mentioned there is an inconsistency with major events compared to smaller events and we need to maintain these standards. We understand that the process of accreditation for volunteer organisations and clubs is challenging, and we want to make sure we have a process that is easier and more tailored to you for when we roll it out. It is easier to justify the extra workload of taking on this process for larger events when the spotlight of HSE and the local councils is more on us but the aspiration is to get to a point where we have this level of accreditation and health and safety compliance for all events.

South Midlands Regional Chair Vacancy

As you will have read, our Regional Chair, Chris Whitlock, has decided to retire from his Chair role at the AGM in October 2024. I am sure that you will join with me in thanking Chris for all his hard work as South Midlands Regional Chair since he took on the role in 2019, and wish him all good wishes for the future.

South Midlands Region BMMC are looking to appoint a new Regional Chair to lead the region.

Candidates for the Regional Chair vacancy will need to submit:

- (a) Confirmation that they are eligible under Article 29, including that they are a Full or Life Member, their Grade (being above that of Registered Marshal), confirmation that they are formally affiliated to South Midlands Region and have marshalled at least one event in the previous 12 months, and list any other BMMC roles currently held.
- (b) Confirmation of their understanding that on election to the role, they will take on responsibilities as a company director under the Companies Act 2006, and their willingness and legal eligibility to do so.
- (c) An optional statement of no more than 200 words which will be circulated to the regional membership in the event of an election being required, setting out their experience and plans should they be successful in the election, supported by a relevant CV.
- (d) Details of a proposer and seconder for their nomination, both of whom must be formally affiliated to South Midlands region.

The role description for the Regional Chair role can be found on the next page.

Should any South Midlands member wish to stand for election to the role of South Midlands Regional Chair please submit the above information by email to sm.secretary@marshals.co.uk by 17th August at 5 pm. A nomination form can be found on a subsequent page.

Once applications have been received, discussions will be held between the applicant and an appropriate Director or Vice president to ensure the applicant has a full understanding of the role. Once these discussions have concluded, in accordance with J.3.7 an electronic ballot will be held by a simple majority, with the candidate with the most votes being declared elected.

If any regional member does not have an email registered on the database postal voting forms will be issued to these members only. Polling will be open for a 2-week period.

It is the aim of the region to have a new Regional Chair (elect) in place to shadow the current Regional Chair for the Board meeting in September 2024, and for the successful candidate to take up the full role at the AGM in October 2024.

- Be free of bankruptcy

- Represent the BMMC region on relevant motorsport forums
- Improve communications in the region and nationally
- Ensure the region reflects BMMC core principles and objectives

Actions

Including but not limited to:

- Chair BMMC Regional Committee Meetings
- Attend BMMC National Council meetings as a Director and to represent the Region
- Participate in National Council policy making as a Director of BMMC
- Liaise with National Officers and fellow Directors on development of new strategies and policies
- Provide feedback to Regional Committee and members on National Council decisions
- Approve appointment of new Directors and recruitment of new members
- Provide advice and guidance for members on request
- Ensure Regional Committee complies with BMMC financial procedures as advised by National Treasurer
- Motivate and support the committee to deliver their objectives
- Ensure that Region follows BMMC policy guidelines, rules and Articles of Association
- Use every opportunity to communicate and meet with members
- Abide by Motorsport UK Race with Respect
- Abide by confidentiality at Regional Committee, National Council and in dialogue with members, (written, verbal and on social media)

The South Midlands committee meets on alternate months, at present on the internet using Zoom, and all members are welcome to join us. Please see the meeting calendar below. Here is a summary of some of the topics that the committee has covered since the last Newsletter:

- The committee held a special meeting in the week after the British Grand Prix to collate feedback about the event. Some committee members had been marshalling, others were in the Marshal's Welfare teams and some had been involved in the Motorsport-UK led recruitment area. The appalling weather did not help the smooth running of the event, but it was clear there were some underlying issues in many areas which directly impacted on marshalling and marshals. If you were there and want your voice heard, please take part in the two surveys, one from BMMC and the other from MSUK.
- BMMC had been contacted by BARC about marshal recruitment at BTTC events, which BARC wanted to spearhead. However, they have not had a recruitment stand at any of the BTCC events so far in 2024, so Glynn is continuing to plan for a BMMC stand at Silverstone on September 21-22. If you want to help on either day please contact Glynn on sm.recruitment@marshals.co.uk. Glynn is also leading our recruitment activities at Silverstone Festival on August 23-25, at Kop Hill Climb on September 14-15 and Bicester Scramble on October 6th, and again would welcome any members joining him for the day.
- The committee discussed an issue that a member had in contacting the Chief Marshal of an event to ask for an assessment, using the contact details listed on the BMMC Volunteering system. The problem was compounded in that the person who received the request failed to both pass on the request or tell the requestor that it was not something they could arrange, leaving the requestor unsure what was happening. Fortunately, it was sorted out and the assessment was done, but Glynn is investigating what can be done to improve the information.
- Silverstone have agreed to provide tickets so that BMMC can restart Taster Days, so our first one is planned for August 17th. Kaz is busy sending out invitations, and is keen to hear from anyone willing to be a guide on the day. Please contact Kaz on sm.members@marshals.co.uk if you would like to help. If you are marshalling at Silverstone that day, and see the Taster people either on their morning walk-about or on post in the afternoon, please give them a cheery greeting and tell them how great it is to be a marshal!
- All BMMC marshals are invited to Race Training on November 16-17 at Silverstone, organised by BRSCC. Entry is free but pre-booking is essential so go to the BRSCC website for details.
- The committee has set the date for the AGM and annual end-of-season get-together as October 26th, which is, as usual, after the Birkett Relay Race. We are yet to finalise the venue or the nature of the event, but it will involve hot food so please come along.

Please let me know if there is anything you would like the Committee to discuss so I can add it to the agenda, but please let me know at least 2 weeks before the meeting. The dates for 2024 are below and the meeting starts at 19:45.
