Trainee In a Pandemic

I'm not sure what I expected to get out of marshalling as I drove into the car park at Castle Combe on a cold and overcast Sunday morning in early March 2020 for my first ever training day. So far things were going to plan, I'd done a taster day at the end of 2019, Joined the BMMC and MSUK over the winter, and was getting ready for the 2020 season. After sign on I wandered over to grab a coffee, feeling strangely conspicuous, not being attired in bright orange. The room was humming with the background noise of chatter and banter, punctuated occasionally by raucous laughter or a shout to, or at, a newly arrived marshal. I took a seat at a table with couple of similarly dressed newbies.

The training was excellent, a good balance of hands-on practical skills along with some theory, and some scary but useful videos of what not to do! I came away from the day with a newfound appreciation for the teamwork involved in marshalling, as well as a few unanswered questions (like why do you call an extinguisher a bottle? †)

A week later, I was at Thruxton, doing my second training day, I figured that reinforcement helps learning, and having a second trainer's perspective would be a good thing. It was. I came a way with some of the questions I had the previous week answered, but still didn't know why you call an extinguisher a bottle[†].

And then Lockdown! I was pretty sure that would be it for 2020, even as MSUK started to open events, initially running with 2 marshals per post and then with up to 6 socially distanced. Understandably trainees at this point were barred from participation. Out of sheer boredom I started to work through the training material on the MSUK web site. Irritatingly, there was little material specifically for marshals, with the marshal's pathway simply showing "Coming Soon" – it never did.

As confidence grew in running meetings with covid precautions, trainees were permitted back towards the end of 2020, so long as they were performing an actual role, not just shadowing. Armed with two days training, and a bunch of MSUK training course completion certificates, I made a pitch to the Castle Combe chief marshal to see if there was any chance of marshalling that year. To my surprise the reaction was positive, and I managed to get 5 days experience at the end of the season.

Those first few events felt pressured, any other year I could probably have expected to just shadow another marshal, but not this year. What did become clear in those first few days was how everyone on post has each other's back. Even as a newbie I immediately felt part of the team and was clear on exactly what was expected of me. I am extremely grateful for the encouragement and advice in those first few meetings.

The 2021 season started late. Because the season was compressed and the headline championships moved their events later in the season, there were a number of date clashes at my 2 "local" circuits, so I started to volunteer at Brands Hatch as well, mostly at club level events as I figured the marshal numbers would be lower, so I had more chance of being accepted, though as it turned out 6 marshals per post was aspirational for some of those events. Again, I'm grateful for all the guidance and support I received. There's no doubt marshals are a tight knit community, but certainly open to trainees that are prepared to

listen and pull their weight, maybe not so much for those that aren't.

It was at Brands Hatch that I had my first close one. Post 20, Stirlings, a 90° left. It was a pre-66 touring car race and a Mustang had just pirouetted into the edge of the gravel as he exited the corner, he'd been promising to do it for the previous couple of laps. He'd only dropped the rear wheels into the gravel, so we had a fair chance of pushing him clear. Unfortunately, he'd dug himself deep and we couldn't shift it. We retreated towards the Armco. As we headed back there was a muffled shout from our flaggie drowned out by the sound of showering gravel as a Lotus Cortina came ploughing through the gravel, splitting the group of retreating marshals before continuing. We joked about it afterwards, but we all knew how close it had been. For me it was a wakeup call, I don't think I had appreciated how fast things can go wrong; valuable lesson learned.

I don't think I can write about my journey from trainee to track marshal without mentioning the tragedy at Brands Hatch this year. I didn't know Robert Foote, and I'm fortunate as I wasn't there that day, but like all marshals I've spoken to, I felt a profound sense of shock and grief at the news. I don't suppose I was the only marshal that had difficult conversations with family in the following days. Once again though, I was struck by the outpouring of solidarity, not just from marshals in this country, but around the world. We truly are an #OrangeFamily.

I was recently fortunate to spend a couple of days on post with the post chief on Post 2 at Brands Hatch on the day of the incident. I am genuinely in awe of the courage of this man, not only in returning to marshalling, but also in writing an article for the BMMC SE region <u>Autumn newsletter</u>, which I commend to all.

So, what about those initial expectations from my first training day? More time at circuits \checkmark New skills \checkmark Close to the action \checkmark But the one that surprised me most, and that I value, has been the camaraderie and community of the #OrangeFamily. I can't wait for the season to start.
