

6, Ordinary resolution to amend Club Rules – Proposed Colin Barnes, seconded by Paul Wiltshire

Discussion took place on the proposed changes to the Club Rules and a vote taken.



Resolution was passed by the meeting to accept changes to the Club Rules.


7, Special Resolution, - to amend the Company's Articles of Association.

Proposed by Colin Barnes, Seconded by Paul Wiltshire. Discussion took place and a vote then taken by the meeting



Again votes do not show 2 proxy votes held by Secretary or Secretary's vote so 25 votes cast for the resolution No votes 3 Resolution was passed by the meeting to accept amendments to Articles of Association.

8, Ordinary Resolution – to re-appoint for financial year 2021 Azets formally known as Booth Ainsworth LLP as accountants to BMMC Ltd. Proposed by Colin Barnes, Seconded by Paul Wiltshire. Discussion took place and a vote then taken by the meeting.



Again 2 proxy votes held by Secretary and Secretary's vote not shown so; Votes cast for motion 28 No votes 0 One person had left meeting early. Resolution passed unanimously by the meeting to re-appoint Booth Ainsworth.

Both the Ordinary resolutions and the special resolution all were passed gaining more than the required pass percentage for such resolutions.

9, Election of new Treasurer

In accordance with Club Rules J 3.4. Colin Barnes is standing down as National treasurer – he does not offer himself for re-election. Due to application from two candidates a vote was put to membership and Stephen Woolfe was duly elected as the new Treasurer. This appointment requires ratification accordingly. The meeting agreed to ratify the appointment.

10, Annual Awards

The winners will be informed at a later date by socially distancing means. The names will not be announced at this meeting so as not to spoil the surprise for the recipients.

11, <u>AOB</u>

The issue of training was raised on chat. Nadine informed the meeting that regions had submitted and had accepted by BMSTT grants for training. In what form this takes will be decided by the restrictions in place in the future because of the Covid pandemic. The plan "B" is to look at online training.

Grading was raised by chat. Nadine informed the meeting that all grades were being honoured and taken forward to 2021 by Motorsport UK, as no assessments were able to be undertaken this year.

George Copeland proposed a vote of thanks to the Council for their hard work during this difficult year in such trying circumstances, this was seconded by Chris Hobson.

There being no other business the meeting was closed at 16.30

National Chairman's Report

At the end of last year's National AGM I asked our IT and Communications Officers to consider how we could have an electronic AGM in 2020 to enable more members to become involved – Facebook live streaming / Zoom etc. Little did I know what was about to happen!

We started 2020 full of optimism and renewed energy.....

We marked the 40th anniversary of BRMC at Autosport International in January with the launch of a new logo and National Rally Award. Sadly Autosport International will not be taking place in January if at all in 2021.

Most regions ran successful training days in the early part of the year – we even managed a National Council meeting in February at Milton Keynes and then the World paused.

COVID-19 took over every news bulletin on every channel, on every Social Media platform across the world. The numbers were depressing, the rules confusing, the mood blackening and all Motorsport ceased.

Many people have suffered physically, emotionally, psychologically and financially as a consequence of this pandemic. The devastating consequences and pressures of lockdown, people put on furlough, unable to meet with friends and family and losing loved ones to this dreadful virus.

We introduced an Employee Assistance Programme at the beginning of the year – not expecting it to be required by many – but I hope that those of you who have needed support were able to use this service and I am so grateful we put it in place when we did.

Motorsport took a back seat while we all tried to figure out how to use Zoom; juggled family and work at home; decorated our houses; spruced up our gardens; homeschooled; baked (in the sun and using the oven!). We did ok – some of the time. We struggled – lots. We kept in touch and kept each others' spirits up.

We socially distanced, we washed our hands, we started wearing masks.

Then at the beginning of May I had my first call from Motorsport UK to ask me to join the COVID-19 Motorsport Restart Panel to represent marshals.

I have to say hats off to Motorsport UK – who furloughed most of their staff – but those left worked tirelessly to put the Restart Guidance together. Along with a

number of us on the panel who had regular, often short notice meetings (on Zoom of course!) to discuss, agree and suggest the ways in which we could make Motorsport work. Everything was discussed – everything was considered and above all the safety and well-being of attendees in line with government regulations was paramount.

Some things worked. Some didn't. Some things changed – sometimes overnight. We were learning as we went along – we were subject matter experts but nobody had all the answers. And nobody had dealt with such an "unprecedented" situation before.

Within a month we had a plan and events were allowed to re-start again from the beginning of July. But still we were learning – clubs, venues, clerks, officials, marshals and competitors all had a part to play.

But....we did it!!!

Everyone so desperately wanted to get back to Motorsport that they adhered to the rules (or accepted reminders with dignity!); they read and re-read the guidelines; they followed procedures – everyone worked together to make it work.

As far as I am aware there have been no reports of the virus being transmitted at a Motorsport event – which is a testament to everyone's commitment.

And for those of you who were able to attend an event – did it feel good? To witness the competition but above all to have some human contact (socially distanced of course). The chance to catch up with friends in the orange family – to have some fun, to do what we love. I actually felt more safe going to an event than I did to the supermarket!

We even had two British Grand Prix – with no spectators; driving to post each day but still able to share a socially distanced beer on the campsite. They will never be repeated but an opportunity to be part of a unique experience. Many of you I know were unable to attend any events – due to personal health, financial situations and trainees – can they / can't they attend decisions which left people baffled and frustrated.

And as for Wales – devastated at the lack of Motorsport I hope they come back stronger in 2021. Scotland and Northern Ireland were both able to hold some events. The confusion between the devolved powers regulations was difficult to follow but Wales and now Scotland making it illegal to travel out of the country also prevented some marshals travelling to events.

But rallying was hit hard. I thank Jon Cordery who tirelessly updated our BRMC Facebook page for all rally marshals (not just members) to keep track of

cancellations / postponements / re-arranged events. No small task but greatly appreciated by everyone across the rallying community.

At the first British Grand Prix our President Ben Edwards was able to reference the marshals on Channel 4 commentary and we had a huge surge of interest (hoping to get in to Motorsport venues for free in some cases but genuine interest from many). The Sky TV commentary team also contributed the following week! We recruited new members – but were unable to offer taster days. I thank the regional recruitment teams for keeping them informed of the ongoing situation and hope we can re-start this vital process again in 2021. Motorsport UK are providing some online training for newbies to keep them interested and advised of what happens next too.

Charities have this year taken a huge blow to their income and as such we have decided to continue to support Race Against Dementia into 2021.

Our sponsors have all agreed in these trying times to continue to support the club into 2021 and therefore ensure our overalls remain fully subsidised despite a small increase.

We have agreed to a 50% discount on our membership renewals for 2021 to reflect the reduced activities of 2020.

I thank everyone on our regional committees and Council for their hard work and dedication through a trying year. They make my job so much easier!

I thank Neil Stretton who stands down as our SE Chair and Colin Barnes who stands down as our National Treasurer for their support of the club.

Colin also has been a sage advisor to myself and Paul and I am sure I will continue to ask for his words of wisdom – even if it's just at signing on at Oulton Park!

I also would like to take this opportunity to announce that both Neil and Colin will receive Life Membership of the Club - thank you both. And Colin a small token of our appreciation will be sent in due course.

Motorsport UK have recently created an Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Committee - an initiative we welcome at BMMC.

We are, and have always been, one club and one family; We recognise and respect each every one of our members for who they are, regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, religion or sexuality.

We welcome everyone into our Orange Family – we do not tolerate discrimination of any kind.

Our database shows your age (for insurance purposes only) but not your ethnicity, religion, nationality or sexual orientation; while we may not have any statistics to show or targets to meet, we embrace everyone's uniqueness and encourage you to come forward and speak up and out.

Finally it's great to have seen so many of you electronically today and throughout the year and I hope that I can see more of you in person next year.

Secretary's Report to AGM 06.12.2020

This year there has been four National Council meetings held, two full council meetings at the beginning and end of the year, two others being directors only meetings held during the year. All of which have been held as virtual meetings using the Zoom system. There have also been additional virtual Council meetings held, unfortunately to deal with disciplinary matters. In these difficult times virtual meetings were the only way that our Council could meet. It has thrown up some technical issues. But these have been overcome and Council were able to continue it's work throughout the year. Using virtual meetings has made us look at in a very different way, how such meetings had to be structured and run. Looking forward to 2021 unless there is a big improvement in the situation, virtual meetings are looking to be continuing, but I would hope that there can be at least one meeting held face to face next year if the circumstances allow it. One good outcome with holding more virtual meetings is that there is a cost saving to the club, saving on travel and other costs which benefits the club. One task will be for me to hone my I.T skills as I can see virtual meetings will I think be used more frequently in the future, as will the use of digital storage. The cost savings for the club make it an obvious progression.

The review undertaken of the Club Rules & Articles of Association has been completed and been to Council in September. These draft documents were sent out to members with the notice of AGM for comment. They will then be presented to the AGM for ratification. The Club's Repository has been live for a while and is being populated with BMMC documentation / photos / minutes. All regional secretaries should now have access to upload to and download from the system. Just a reminder that all documents uploaded need to be in PDF format.

This second year as club secretary has gone very quickly, mainly due to the strange and difficult situation we all find ourselves in. But it has not stopped the club officials and committee's from working to provide the service our members needed. Since the September Council there has been a ballot of the members for a new Club Treasurer due to Colin Barnes stepping down from post. There were two applicants for the post. The result of the members ballot was that Steve Woolfe was duly elected to post. Steve as you know was the Club Secretary before myself. I offer my congratulations to Steve and welcome him to the Council. The SE Region also has a new Chairman. Bob McEwan being elected by the region, I welcome Bob to National Council also. To finish I wish to congratulate everyone for their efforts, also the members for their dedication to the sport and for the way they supported the club and motorsport to get things happening. For many it's been a scary and worrying year with many having to stand down for various reasons. I want to wish you all well, keep yourselves safe and lets get marshaling again next year.

TREASURER'S REPORT AGM 06 DEC 2020

[1] 2019 Unaudited Accounts:

Under Club Rules I am required to present suitably prepared accounts for year 2019 as a matter of record.

The accounts, prepared by Booth Ainsworth LLP, were approved in September (delayed by coronavirus issues) and duly filed at Companies House fulfilling our statutory obligations.

The accounts along with a summary commentary have been posted on the Club's website.

I therefore propose to present only a brief recap of the headline figures, with 2018 figures for comparison, as follows: -

At the 2018 AGM I reported that the long running VAT investigation was nearing an end with a £6,000 refund already banked. As you will see from the figures presented, we received a refund of almost £18,000 and HMRC withdrew all action and amended assessments made against the Club. This matter is now closed.

A contributory factor was our decision to de-register on 31 December 2018.

A final point to note is that our Reserves as at the year returned to the level of 2017 year.

[2] 2020 Financial Performance:

Tempting as it may be pretend this year never existed, I am able to report some very positive points –

- Membership income has held up well.
- We have again received some very welcome donations, notably from GT Cup Championship, MGCC, CTCRC and WMRAC (affectionately known as the "Doghouse Owners Club").
- Regalia sales are approaching £4,000, helped by the introduction of snoods and face masks.
 We now have an efficient central ordering system and Paypal payment platform accounting for
 over 90% of sales this must be Eric's finest hour. Thanks for all your very thorough work
 sourcing, ordering, and selling. As and when life returns to "normal" stock will be distributed to
 regions and we will trial a remote Paypal card reader.
- Administration and operating expenses have been drastically cut.
- Our adjusted bank position at the year-end will be circa £120,000 credit.
- I am projecting a surplus income of circa £20,000 with a corresponding increase in our balance sheet reserves.

In the light of this performance Council has been able to make two key decisions –

- 1. To increase the Lille clothing subsidy to £95, maintaining 100% of base cost and postage.
- 2. A 50% discount on all 2021 membership subscriptions paid before 1st February 2021.

[3] Sponsorship:

Despite the dreaded virus Lille Racewear has been able to fulfil orders with minimal delay and by and large their service is working very well. I am aware a small number of members have experienced issues with accurate sizing and equally Anthony Bianco has regaled me with some most humorous tales of members trying to measure themselves with steel tape measures. Let me place on record "this will never work!"

Throughout 2019 and 2020 the Club has been able to subsidise the full costs of a standard set of overalls and postage. In November we agreed some changes to Club badging and a small price increase through to the end of 2021. The base cost, with postage is now £95, and I am pleased to confirm the subsidy has increased accordingly.

When I started as Treasurer the subsidy was £40 and it is now £95 and as a Club, we must acknowledge the invaluable support of our sponsors. In 2020 our sponsors NGK, Mike Newton (TIGA), Polyfold, MGCC, Ginetta and Cataclean were joined by CSCC. A huge thank you to all.

[4] Signing-off

Having served two 3-year terms as your Treasurer and with Club finances and operations on a very sound footing this always seemed the right time to hand over the reins. Knowing that Steve Woolfe was available to come onboard provided reassurance there would be a smooth succession and an injection of new perspectives and fresh ideas.

In signing-off I would like to congratulate Nadine on driving the Club forward with a high level of energy, particularly this year juggling the demands of her full-time job and representing the marshalling community in umpteen Zoom meetings with Motorsport UK to shape the response to coronavirus.

Over the last 6 years there has been a complete change in the composition of the Club Directors and I would thank those past and present for the support they have given me. I will of course continue to serve the Club as its Bookkeeper.

Actions update

6a Recruitment Equipment - National recruitment Officer has been advised of South Mids requirements. All plans for recruitment were abandoned because of Covid restrictions though the Sywell Pits & Props meeting went ahead.

Aims & Objectives

My first objective is to improve communications in the region:

Get the committee working together and keeping each other informed with what is going on; Get myself known to our members, invite them to talk to me; and Improve relations with SMT so that we can work together on mutually beneficial projects

My second objective is to get the right resources so that the committee can communicate with members:

Items for discussion

- 1. Firstly I can report some further changes in the committee following our AGM in October. Christopher Hatch our web admin decided not to stand for re-election and Simon Spooner informed us that because of an increased workload he no longer felt he could spare sufficient time for a committee post but would be willing to help where he could. Happily Steven Morris volunteered to join us and we have decided to combine the Taster Day co-ordinator role with Membership Secretary and Steve has accepted that post. Our only vacancy now is for a web administrator and that will be advertised in the next Newsletter
- 2. Both Marion Quarrington and I are still experiencing problems with our Club email addresses. We can both receive emails but have to resort to using our personal addresses to send as it is hit and miss if the message will reach all addresses. Sean is on the case.
- **3.** Sadly Lesley Harris passed away on 8th September. Because of Covid restrictions no one from the region's committee was able to attend the funeral but the region donated £200 to the family.
- **4.** The acceptance of trainee marshals at Silverstone meetings has been a bit hit and miss. Sometimes there is a requirement for 15 days experience and at other times no experience is required. During conversations with members I learnt that many trainees simply did not bother to volunteer anticipating they would not be chosen.
- 5. Once again I decided to telephone all South Midland members to check how they were coping when the second lockdown was announced. I did not get to speak to everyone, but those who did not answer were invited to ring me and many did, if only to thank me for caring! During these recent calls I learnt that many members are still at work and no one seemed put out by the restrictions. Of our 65 members who have no MS UK registration I discovered that the majority are registered and those who are not are genuinely not marshalling but are happy to remain members and support the club.
- **6.** We have finally acquired admin rights to our second Face Book page and with the help of Dave Smithson have got the page properly badged up.
- 7. We have been concerned that the large number of pending taster day applicants and trainee marshals that have not been able to marshal in 2020 might become disillusioned and demotivated. To keep them engaged and motivated we have obtained some Motor Sport Safety Fund training videos. These have been posted on the public facing page of our website under the heading "More About Marshalling" and two "First Aid" and "Motorsport Marshalling" are on You Tube at https://youtu.be/fk_r5e54UZw and https://youtu.be/ezqKMsgm46Q respectively.
- **8.** Finally Stuart Pringle has agreed to participate in a Zoom Noggin & Natter (without the noggin). Date to be agreed after announcement made about post 2nd December Covid restrictions.

BMMC SE REGION - REPORT TO AGM - 2020

Having only been elected to the role of South East Chair in October 2020, I am still coming to terms with all the relevant processes and requirements of the post.

The region and it's activities has, like all others, been affected significantly by the pandemic and hopes that the new year will deliver some stability and normality for our members and the sport.

Monthly committee meetings now take place in a virtual format and we appear to have adapted well to this new arrangement.

The regional AGM was held on 21 October at which time the chair for the last 8 years, Neil Stretton, decided to step down both from the post and his committee role. Our Volco and long-time committee member Bryan Degerlund also announced his retirement from the committee. I had previously volunteered to take on the chairman role and committee voted in favour of my application at our September meeting.

Following a local application and interview process, current committee member Chris Humphreys was selected to take over the Volco role. The committee also welcomed new members, Bridget Rivers-Moore (web site administrator), Mark Manley and Stephen Tickner – both trainee grade marshals, following a successful voting process. Our current Snetterton representative, Tony Lacey had earlier announced he would be standing down at the end of the year and his role will be taken over by Chris Barningham. We also continue to receive enthusiastic support from Andrew Elliott in his role as representative for Lydden Hill Circuit. We will pursue our aim to recruit additional reps in other 'non circuit' disciplines as circumstances allow.

Our regional membership currently sits around 467, a drop of around 7% compared with last year. Recruitment has been negligible with around 150 enquiries awaiting progress when we can. Our Facebook page has approx. 415 subscribers and the MailChimp mailing list around 600. The regional newsletter, Marshals' Post, has now moved to a quarterly format and efforts continue to generate greater involvement with the members and the publication.

It is likely that no annual regional award winners will be selected this year, but plans are currently being formulated for a new approach to promote this process during next season and to encourage increased member engagement.
